STREET TRADING CONSENT REQUEST FOR RESOLUTION - CALDECOTE

Purpose

1. To seek approval for the designation of all the streets in the Parish of Caldecote to be Consent Streets under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

Effect on Corporate Objectives

2. Quality of Village life – to afford a degree of control on trading within the Village.

Background

- Caldecote Parish Council requested that all streets in the Parish be designated as Consent Streets so that trading could be controlled. The Licensing Committee held on the 23 February 2006 agreed to this request.
- 4. A Notice of Intention to designate all streets in Caldecote was published in the local press on 28 July 2006, with a deadline of receipt of objections by 25 August 2006; no objections were received.
