#### **GUIDANCE NOTES FOR VISITORS TO SOUTH CAMBRIDGESHIRE HALL**

While the District Council endeavours to ensure that visitors come to no harm when visiting South Cambridgeshire Hall, those visitors also have a responsibility to make sure that they do not risk their own or others' safety.

#### Security

Members of the public attending meetings in non-public areas of the Council offices must report to Reception, sign in, and at all times wear the Visitor badges issued. Before leaving the building, such visitors must sign out and return their Visitor badges to Reception.

#### **Emergency and Evacuation**

In the event of a fire, a continuous alarm will sound. Evacuate the building using the nearest escape route; from the Council Chamber or Mezzanine viewing gallery this would be via the staircase just outside the door. Go to the assembly point at the far side of the staff car park.

- Do not use the lifts to exit the building. If you are unable to negotiate stairs by yourself, the
  emergency staircase landings are provided with fire refuge areas, which afford protection for a
  minimum of 1.5 hours. Press the alarm button and wait for assistance from the Council fire
  wardens or the fire brigade.
- **Do not** re-enter the building until the officer in charge or the fire brigade confirms that it is safe to

## **Access for People with Disabilities**

There are disabled toilet facilities on each floor of the building. Hearing loops and earphones are available from reception and can be used in all meeting rooms.

Unless specifically authorised by resolution, no audio and / or visual or photographic recording in any format is allowed at any meeting of the Council, the executive (Cabinet), or any committee, sub-committee or other sub-group of the Council or the executive.

### Banners, Placards and similar items

No member of the public shall be allowed to bring into or display at any Council meeting any banner, placard, poster or other similar item. The Chairman may require any such item to be removed.

#### **Disturbance by Public**

If a member of the public interrupts proceedings, the Chairman will warn the person concerned. If they continue to interrupt, the Chairman will order their removal from the meeting room. If there is a general disturbance in any part of the meeting room open to the public, the Chairman may call for that part to be cleared.

#### **Smoking**

Since 1 July 2008, the Council has operated a new Smoke Free Policy. Visitors are not allowed to smoke at any time within the Council offices, or in the car park or other grounds forming part of those offices.

### **Food and Drink**

Vending machines and a water dispenser are available on the ground floor near the lifts at the front of the building. Visitors are not allowed to bring food or drink into the meeting room.

#### **Mobile Phones**

Visitors are asked to make sure that their phones and other mobile devices are set on silent / vibrate mode during meetings or are switched off altogether.

## **CAXTON PARISH COUNCIL: REQUESTS FOR DISPENSATIONS**

## **Purpose**

1. Caxton Parish Councillors Richard Bartram, Margaret Harrison, Kirsty Human and Nigel Pearson have applied formally for dispensations to enable them to remain in meetings and to discuss and vote on matters concerning Ermine Street, Caxton. This is not a key decision.

## **Recommendations and Reasons**

2. That the Standards Committee grant dispensations until May 2014, the duration of the current Parish Council, to Caxton Parish Councillors Richard Bartram, Margaret Harrison, Kirsty Human and Nigel Pearson with the reminder that they are still to declare an interest in any matters concerning Ermine Street as described below, and to declare that they have received a dispensation for that interest.

## **Background**

- 3. Under *The Standards Committee (Further Provisions) (England) Regulations 2009*, the Standards Committee may grant a dispensation to a member in the following circumstances:
  - (a) where the transaction of business of the authority would, but for the grant of any other dispensation in relation to that business, on each occasion on which the dispensation would apply, otherwise be impeded by, or as a result of, the mandatory provisions because
    - (i) the number of members of the authority prohibited from voting on the business of the authority at a meeting exceeds 50% of those members that, but for the granting of any dispensations relating to that business, would otherwise be entitled to vote on that business; or
    - (ii) the number of members prohibited from voting on the business of the authority at a meeting would, but for the granting of any dispensations relating to that business, upset the political balance of that meeting to such an extent as to prejudice the outcome of voting in that meeting;
  - (b) the member has submitted to the standards committee a written request for a dispensation explaining why it is desirable; and
  - (c) the standards committee concludes that having regard to the matters mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) above, the written request made pursuant to sub-paragraph (b) above, and to any other relevant circumstances of the case, it is appropriate to grant the dispensation.
- 4. Nothing in paragraph 3 above shall permit a dispensation to be granted
  - (a) in respect of participation in business of the authority conducted more than four years after the date on which the dispensation is granted; or
  - (b) where the effect of the mandatory provisions from which a dispensation is sought is that

- (i) a member is prohibited from voting on a matter at a meeting of an overview and scrutiny committee of an authority relating to a decision made by any body of which that person was a member at the time the decision was taken; or
- (ii) a member of the authority's executive is prohibited from exercising functions which are the responsibility of the executive of the authority and which would otherwise be discharged by that member solely.

## Considerations

5. The parish councillors have noted on their application forms that five of seven members of the Parish Council live on Ermine Street.

### **Options**

6. Not to grant a dispensation could leave the Parish Council unable to discuss any matters relating to Ermine Street, which is the main thoroughfare in the village and the road upon which the majority of Caxton's residents live.

## **GAMLINGAY PARISH COUNCIL: REQUESTS FOR DISPENSATIONS**

## **Purpose**

1. Councillors Peter Dolling, David Finnigan, Lewis Girdwood, Maggy Halliday, Jason Nicholas, David Sadler and Ian Simpson, of Gamlingay Parish Council, have applied formally for dispensations to enable them to remain in meetings and vote on matters concerning the Community Centre's financial affairs or which relate to regulatory issues such as planning permission, licensing or contracts. This is not a key decision, but has been brought to this extraordinary meeting of the Standards Committee due to the time constraints described below at paragraph 6, which would prevent this issue being considered at the Standards Committee meeting scheduled for 15 September 2010.

#### **Recommendations and Reasons**

2. That the Standards Committee grant dispensations until May 2014, the duration of the current Parish Council, to Gamlingay Parish Councillors Peter Dolling, David Finnigan, Lewis Girdwood, Maggy Halliday, Jason Nicholas, David Sadler and Ian Simpson, with the reminder that they are still to declare an interest in any matters concerning Gamlingay Community Centre as described below, and to declare that they have received a dispensation for that interest.

## **Background**

- 3. Under *The Standards Committee (Further Provisions) (England) Regulations 2009*, the Standards Committee may grant a dispensation to a member in the following circumstances:
  - (a) where the transaction of business of the authority would, but for the grant of any other dispensation in relation to that business, on each occasion on which the dispensation would apply, otherwise be impeded by, or as a result of, the mandatory provisions because
    - (i) the number of members of the authority prohibited from voting on the business of the authority at a meeting exceeds 50% of those members that, but for the granting of any dispensations relating to that business, would otherwise be entitled to vote on that business; or
    - (ii) the number of members prohibited from voting on the business of the authority at a meeting would, but for the granting of any dispensations relating to that business, upset the political balance of that meeting to such an extent as to prejudice the outcome of voting in that meeting;
  - (b) the member has submitted to the standards committee a written request for a dispensation explaining why it is desirable; and
  - (c) the standards committee concludes that having regard to the matters mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) above, the written request made pursuant to sub-paragraph (b) above, and to any other relevant circumstances of the case, it is appropriate to grant the dispensation.

- 4. Nothing in paragraph 3 above shall permit a dispensation to be granted
  - in respect of participation in business of the authority conducted more than four years after the date on which the dispensation is granted; or
  - (b) where the effect of the mandatory provisions from which a dispensation is sought is that
    - (i) a member is prohibited from voting on a matter at a meeting of an overview and scrutiny committee of an authority relating to a decision made by any body of which that person was a member at the time the decision was taken; or
    - (ii) a member of the authority's executive is prohibited from exercising functions which are the responsibility of the executive of the authority and which would otherwise be discharged by that member solely.
- 5. The parish councillors have noted on their application forms that, "The Parish Council is seeking to enhance community facilities within the village with a major refurbishment project for the Community Centre, transforming it into an Eco-Hub. This will involve financial input from the Parish Council, grant applications to external bodies and potentially borrowing money. Planning applications for the Hub will be considered by the Parish Council planning committee and its Finance committee will consider the impact of spending. Members need clarification that they are all entitled to discuss and vote on all issues pertaining to the Community Centre / Hub." The Parish Clerk has advised that the Community Centre is a standing agenda item at all full council meetings.
- 6. The Parish Clerk has further advised that there will be major grant decisions on 1 September 2010 and a special meeting of the Parish Council on 3 September 2010 at which point the Parish Council must decide whether or not the contractors will be asked to commence work immediately. The project is behind schedule and the tender price is only valid until the second week of September. Several of the Parish Councillors who currently hold dispensations will be on holiday at this time, and the Parish Council seeks to ensure that at least 50% of the Parish Council will have the necessary dispensations to enable the authority to debate and determine the matter.

#### **Considerations**

- The Deputy Monitoring Officer advised the Parish Council prior to the December 2009 Standards Committee meeting that, as the parish council as a whole is the holding / custodian trustee, all councillors would have a personal interest in the community centre but it is likely that they would have a prejudicial interest only in matters concerning the financial affairs of the centre or which involve any regulatory issue such as planning permission, licensing, or contracts. The Parish Council has been further advised that, while holding a position of authority on the management committee increases the chance of the public perception being that the councillor has a prejudicial interest, it does not mean that those councillors who are just trustees and not members of the management committee do not also have a prejudicial interest. For this reason, the Deputy Monitoring Officer recommended that all members of the Parish Council apply for dispensations.
- 8. The Standards Committee, at its meeting of 9 December 2009, having heard that there were two vacancies then on Gamlingay Parish Council, granted dispensations to the ten current members of Gamlingay Parish Council, and advised the Parish Council that any newly-elected or co-opted members to the two vacancies should apply for similar dispensations upon election or co-option. At the meeting of 10 March 2010, the Standards Committee granted identical dispensations to the two

- newly co-opted members of Gamlingay Parish Council. At the meeting of 16 June 2010, a dispensation was granted to a member who had been recently co-opted.
- 9. Councillor Simpson was one of the members granted a four-year dispensation from this interest on 9 December 2009, but resigned from the Parish Council in January 2010, and now seeks a new dispensation following his re-election in May 2010.

## **Options**

10. Not to grant a dispensation could leave the Parish Council unable to discuss any regulatory matters relating to Gamlingay Community Centre, as members' holidays and the recent changes in the composition of the Parish Council could mean that more than 50% of the Parish Council would not be covered by a dispensation and therefore unable to participate.


