1. PROPOSED FEES AND CHARGES FOR HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES 2017/18

The Environmental Services Portfolio Holder

AGREED

- A) The fees and charges as set out in appendix 1 of the report, with the amendment of the maximum charge for the Serving of Improvement Notices Under the Housing Act 2004 to £550.
- B) The fees and charges for the Commercial Waste Service, as laid out in the report.

Other Options Considered: The Portfolio Holder considered accepting, rejecting or amended the discretionary fees and charges, whilst accepted that statutory fees could not be amended.

Reason For Decision: To contribute to the efficient and cost effective delivery of a range of council services that impact directly on people's safety and health.

2. ACTIVE & HEALTHY 4 LIFE (EXERCISE REFERRAL) SCHEME

The Environmental Services Portfolio Holder

AGREED

- A) That Cottenham centre remain on review to give them opportunity to improve with a new manager.
- B) That Cambourne centre remain on review to see if future development plans can capitalise on the potential of this centre.
- C) To support the future long term vision for the A&H4L scheme.
- D) To support the aims for 2017/2018 financial year.

Other Options Considered: The Portfolio Holder considered whether to continue to support the aims and long-term visions of the A&H4L scheme and which centres, if any, should be kept under review.

Reason For Decision: To further promote the scheme with GPs to increase take up

and targeting of the right people, and to review the scheme at six monthly intervals.
