## Agenda Item 2

#### A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements

Construction work on the new A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon scheme is underway. We are currently carrying out a variety of tasks for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 8pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

#### Full closures

Monday 15th to Thursday 18th (four nights)

A1 southbound between Alconbury and Buckden

Vehicles will be diverted south on the A14 link road, then east on the A14, south on the A1198 and west on the A428 to re-join the A1

Monday 15th to Friday 19th (five nights)

A1 northbound between Buckden and Alconbury

Vehicles will travel east on the A428, north on the A1198, west on the A14 and then north on the A14 link road to re-join the A1

A14 westbound Brampton Hut junction 21 to Ellington junction 20

A signed diversion will be in place. Vehicles will follow the A14 link road at junction 23 to travel north on the A1(M) then travel west on the A605 to re-join the A14 at junction 13

Non motorway traffic west at Wooley Road, south on Ellington Road and west at Wooley Hill to re-join the A14

A14 eastbound Ellington junction 20 to Brampton Hut junction 21

A signed diversion will be in place. Vehicles will travel east on the A605, south on the A1(M) to the A14 link road to rejoin the A14 at junction 23

Non motorway traffic will be diverted east at Wooley Hill, then north on Ellington Road and Wooley Road to re-join the A14.

A428 eastbound Madingley to A14 eastbound Milton junction 33

Motorway traffic will travel south on the M11, east on A505 and north on A11 to re-join the A14. Non motorway traffic will be diverted on local roads through Cambridge.

- M11 junction 14 exit slip
- A14 westbound between Six Mile Bottom junction 36 and Girton junction 31

Motorway traffic will travel south on the A11, west on the A505 and then north on the M11.

Non motorway traffic will diverted on local roads through Cambridge

Friday 19th 9pm to Sunday 21st 6am

A1 southbound between Alconbury and Brampton Hut

Vehicles will be diverted south on the A14 link road, then east on the A14, to re-join the A1 at Brampton Hut

Friday 19th 9pm to Sunday 21st 6pm

Grafham Road

Saturday 20th 6am to Monday 22nd 6am

Conington Road

In accordance with the Council's Constitution, Part 3, Responsibility for Executive Functions I am writing to inform you of the change I wish to make to refine the allocation of functions and responsibilities as set out in Table 2B within the Constitution. The change to take immediate effect upon subsequent written notification to all Members is detailed below.

## Delegated authority to be given to: Executive Director

**Delegation:** To review and determine the boundaries of Rural Settlements for the administration of Rural Rate Relief in accordance with section 42B of the Local Government and Rating Act 1997

Rea	asons for Delegation
1.	The Council is required to determine annually the rural settlements within its area where the population of the settlement is less than 3,000, and to publish a list of settlements indicating their boundaries before 31 <sup>st</sup> December each year, in order to facilitate the award of Rural Rate Relief in the following year
2.	Rural Settlements are reviewed annually to take account of the latest statistical population data. Sources of statistical data are published within the accompanying report.
3.	This is not a decision as such, but it is a legal requirement that boundaries are set and published before 31 <sup>st</sup> December each year.
Bac	kground
4.	Qualifying properties situated within a designated rural settlement are eligible for relief from payment of the National Non-Domestic Rates
5.	To be eligible for rural rate relief, a business must be located in a qualifying rural settlement, which has a population of no more than 3,000 and falls wholly or partly in a rural area designated for the purposes of the rate relief scheme.
6.	In general terms, the business must be occupied and must be the only pub, petrol station, post office or food shop in the designated rural settlement, with a rateable value of less than £12,500 (£8,500 for shops). There is however discretion to award relief to any business in the rural settlement where the rateable value is less than £16,500 and it can be demonstrated that the business is of benefit to the community.
7.	In 2017, Rural Rate Relief totalling around £157,000 was awarded to 42 businesses.
