A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements

Construction work on the new A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon scheme is underway. We are currently carrying out a variety of tasks for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 8pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

Full closures

Monday 22nd to Thursday 25th (four nights)

- A1 northbound between Buckden and Alconbury

Vehicles will travel east on the A428, north on the A1198, west on the A14 and then north on the A14 link road to re-join the A1

- A1 southbound between Alconbury and Buckden

Vehicles will be diverted south on the A14 link road, then east on the A14, south on the A1198 and west on the A428 to re-join the A1

Monday 22nd (one night)

- A14 eastbound between St Ives junction 26 and Girton junction 31

Strategic traffic will be diverted south on the A1198, then east on the A428 to re-join the A14.

Access for local traffic will be maintained between the hard closure and the strategic diversion

- A1307 inbound

Tuesday 23rd to Friday 26th (four nights)

- A14 westbound junction 28 exit slip (Cambridge Services)
- M11 junction 14 exit slip

Tuesday 23rd to Thursday 25th (three nights)

- A14 Girton junction 31 westbound to westbound loop
- A1307 outbound

Wednesday 24th (one night)

- Silver Street
- Hilton Road

Wednesday 24th and Thursday 25th (two nights)

- A14 westbound junction 29 Bar Hill entry slip

Thursday 25th to Friday 26th (two nights)

- Buckinghamway Road

- A1 southbound between Alconbury and Brampton Hut

Vehicles will be diverted south on the A14 link road, then east on the A14, to re-join the A1 at Brampton Hut
