

Below is a link to a letter and annex sent to the Chief Executives of all local authorities from the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government relating to two sets of regulations made under the Coronavirus Act 2020. The first set enables all local authority meetings before 7 May 2021 to be held remotely and removes the requirement for the

annual meeting this year. The second set postpones until 6 May 2021 local by-elections and other polls, either scheduled or which would otherwise arise before that date. Links to both sets of regulations are also included in the documents.



The system will provide a range of information on current and decided applications since 1948, including a brief description of the development, reference number, decision and the date of decision. More recent applications show the name and telephone number of the council officer who is dealing with the application.

Search results are presented in a collection of pages, the number of which depends on the number of results your search produces. There

are navigation tools to allow you to browse your results.

In accordance with the Access to Information
Procedure Rules in Part 4 of the Council's
Constitution, any executive decision shall be
published normally within five days of being made.
That record will bear the date on which it is published and will specify that the decision will come into force, and may then be implemented, on the expiry of 5 working days after the publication of the decision, unless called in for review by the Chairman of the Scrutiny and Overview Committee or by any five other councillors.

A list of decisions currently within the call-in period is available on the Council's website.

The call in procedure is set out in full in <u>Part 4 of the Council's Constitution</u>, 'Scrutiny and Overview Committee Procedure Rules'.


