Thursday 11 February, BBC Online: "Council funding"
Opening a parliamentary debate on the final government finance settlement for 2021/22, Communities Secretary Robert Jenrick told the Commons that a 'handful' of councils were facing "serious financial challenges" and would receive further government support.

#### Friday 12 February, Telegraph: Landfill tax is incentivising fly-tipping

The landfill tax is leading to people misclassifying their waste and dumping it illegally, a National Audit Office report warns.

#### Saturday 13 February, Telegraph: Plan to limit public sector payouts is ditched

The Government has revoked the £95,000 cap on public sector exit payments introduced last November, admitting it had "unintended consequences".


**Monday 15 February, Times:** Remove parking spaces to drive greener travel

# Wednesday 17 February, Times: Councils yet to pay £1.3bn of emergency Covid-19 business grants

More than 80 per cent of the £1.6 billion of emergency grants announced last October has yet to be paid, according to the Events Industry Alliance.
