### Friday 9 July, BBC News: Local government funding

According to a BBC investigation, UK councils plan to make at least £1.7 billion worth of savings in the 2021/22 financial year while also using more than £500 million worth of reserves to balance the books.

Saturday 10 July, Times: Free fruit and veg planned for deprived families

A government ordered review of eating habits will next week recommend that fruit and vegetables should be prescribed free to deprived families to "break the junk food cycle".

Sunday 11 July, Mail on Sunday: <u>Boris Johnson to announce more funding for grassroots sports facilities and measures to boost high streets</u>

The Prime Minister will this week set out his vision of a post Covid-19 Britain and reveal details of his "levelling-up" agenda to boost the country's most disadvantaged areas.

Monday 12 July, Times: Nature belts aim to bring lost life back to edge of towns Plans are being considered by ministers to create a "wild belt" to restore depleted natural habitats which could see bees, butterflies and birds return to the outskirts of towns and cities.

### Monday 12 July, Times: Low-traffic zone fines

The campaign group #BikeIsBest has called on the Government to overhaul rules on low-traffic neighbourhood signage because existing warnings lack clarity, leaving drivers with penalties of £130.

Tuesday 13 July, Mirror: Mayors call for local powers to help reach net zero Local leaders are urging the Government to devolve more powers so authorities can individual tackle climate change ahead of COP26.

### Wednesday 14 July, Mirror: Planning reforms

Labour is urging Tory MPs to bring its plan to impose a time limit on planning applications to incentivise faster building completion with recent LGA research showing more than 1 million homes have planning permission but are yet to be build.

### 5. View Planning Applications



To view the list of planning applications that have recently been submitted to the Council, please visit the authority's on-line <u>Planning</u> Application Search.

The system will provide a range of information on current and decided applications since 1948, including a brief description of the



development, reference number, decision and the date of decision. More recent applications show the name and telephone number of the council officer who is dealing with the application.

Search results are presented in a collection of pages, the number of which depends on the number of results your search produces. There are navigation tools to allow you to browse your results.

### **Executive Decisions Taken Since Wednesday 7 July 2021**



In accordance with the <u>Access to Information</u>

<u>Procedure Rules in Part 4 of the Council's</u>

<u>Constitution</u>, any executive decision shall be published normally within five days of being made.

That record will bear the date on which it is published and will specify that the decision will come into force, and may then be implemented, on the expiry of 5 working days after the publication of the decision, unless called in for review by the Chairman of the Scrutiny and Overview Committee or by any five other councillors.

A list of decisions currently within the call-in period is available on the Council's website.

The call in procedure is set out in full in <u>Part 4 of the Council's Constitution</u>, 'Scrutiny and Overview Committee Procedure Rules'.

# 6. Private Sector Housing Policy (Environmental Health:Enforcement and Licensing) Cabinet:

- a) **Approved** the Private Sector Housing Policy, to ensure the Council follows guidance from the Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government, to tackle substandard conditions in the private rented sector.
- b) **Delegated** authority to the Head of Shared Waste and Environment to make minor amendments, in consultation with the Lead Cabinet Member for Environmental Services and Licensing.

This decision was first published on Wednesday 7 July and so the deadline for call-in is 5pm on Wednesday 14 July.

### 7. Longstanton Conservation Area

Cabinet

**Endorsed** the criteria and approach for the rolling programme of Conservation Area Appraisals and Management Plans reviews, with the programme to be reviewed biannually.

**Confirmed** that it will not prioritise a review the Longstanton Conservation Area at this time.

This decision was first published on 7 July and so the deadline for call-in is Wednesday 14 July at 5 pm.

### 8. Review of the Design Review Service

Cabinet:

- a) **Agreed** to replace the Design Enabling Panel to create the Greater Cambridge Design Review Panel and approve the Terms of Reference (including charges) set out at Appendix B from 1 January 2022.
- b) **Agreed** to grant delegated authority to the Joint Director of Planning and Economic Development in consultation with the Lead Cabinet Member for Planning Policy and Delivery to make minor changes to the Terms of Reference set out at Appendix B.
- c) **Noted** the findings and to implement the recommendations from Urban Design Learning set out in Appendix A.
- d) **Noted** the Milestones for Implementing the GCDRP set out in Appendix D.

This decision was first published on 7 July and so the deadline for call-in is 5pm on Wednesday 14 July.

### 9. Biodiversity Supplementary Planning Document

Cabinet:

**Agreed** to support the passage of this Supplementary Planning Document through this process to the next phase, which is public consultation prior to its return to this committee for review and adoption in late 2021.



## Agenda Item 2

### A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements

We are currently carrying out finishing works for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 9pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

### Full closures

### Saturday 17 8am to 5pm

B1514 Brampton Road between Scholars Avenue and Edison Bell Way
 Vehicles on the Huntingdon town centre side will be diverted onto the ring
 road, St Peters Road to A141 west to Brampton / Brampton Racecourse
 junction and into Brampton via B1514.

Vehicles on the Brampton side of the closure will follow this diversion in reverse.
