Friday 6 August, ITV: Councils call for new public health licensing power

According to the LGA, licensing laws need to be updated to give councils the power to consider the public health impact of licensing decisions.


Monday 9 August, Telegraph: <u>Water pipes could be used to transport broadband to rural homes</u>

More recent applications show the name and telephone number of the council officer who is dealing with the application.

Search results are presented in a collection of pages, the number of which depends on the number of results your search produces. There are navigation tools to allow you to browse your results.

Constitution, any executive decision shall be
published normally within five days of being made.
That record will bear the date on which it is published and will specify that the decision will come into force, and may then be implemented, on the expiry of 5 working days after the publication of the decision, unless called in for review by the Chairman of the Scrutiny and Overview Committee or by any five other councillors.





A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements

We are currently carrying out finishing works for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 9pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

Full closures

Thursday 12 and Friday 13 (two nights)

 A1307(M) southbound between A1(M) southbound junction 14 exit slip and Spittals interchange

Vehicles will be diverted via A1 southbound to Brampton Hut and onto the A141 eastbound

Non-motorway traffic will be diverted onto Ermine Street to re-join the A141 at Spittals
