Rationale: With the pandemic this has hindered progress, so would propose a "deferment" of this so that all Hackney Carriages licenced by this Authority (i.e. to include current fleet changeover) to be wheelchair accessible and white in colour by 1 December 2023.

3.12 Certificate of Compliance - every 12 months for all vehicles (six monthly is probably no longer appropriate due to the implementation of age limits for vehicles). However, where an Officer considers necessary (such as a report of a vehicle defect), a Certificate must be produced every 6 months.	Deferred. Members wished to see the previous decisions and rationale as to why this was previously amended from 12 months to 6 months and will consider at the Licensing Committee.  Note: In November 2019, the Licensing Committee agreed to increase certificate of compliance testing to six monthly in light of introducing a nine-year age limit, and to ensure vehicles met emissions standards.  This requirement has not been implemented to date and implementing the requirement at this time may appear perhaps to be an unnecessary burden on the trade. Officers suggest that the requirement for a six-monthly MOT and Certificate of Compliance should only be where advisories on the MOT are noted or reported concerns raised.

## **Proposal/Option:**

In order to support the trade following the pandemic, it is proposed that allowing an additional two years for drivers to change their vehicles would be a reasonable step and would support the Council's Business Plan priority area of supporting the local economy to recover post-pandemic.

A new diesel vehicle will only be granted if it is under 4 years old until 1 December 2021. \*

A new petrol vehicle will only be granted if it is under 4 years old until 1 December 2023.

## \*Note:

Following the workshop a request that consideration be given to allow diesel wheelchair accessible vehicles to continue to be licensed until December 2023.

Officers recommend this approach considering the request from Panther Cars which stated "the low-level, rear-loading options that are popular among wheelchair customers and which we are trying to encourage more drivers to purchase, such as the Peugeot Horizon etc. – are nearly all diesel only. If purchase/licensing of these is forbidden from Dec 2021 there will major provision issues in an already severely stretched sector of provision."

Taking the above into consideration, and in light of the fact there are only 7 Hackney Carriage vehicles, which are currently all saloon cars, the Chair and Vice Chair of the Licensing Committee are supportive of permitting diesel wheelchair accessible vehicles to be newly licensed until December 2023.

A licence will not be renewed for a petrol or diesel vehicle unless it is less than 9 years old and at least Euro 5 emission standard until December 2023.

In order to support the trade following the pandemic, it is proposed that allowing an additional two years for drivers to change their vehicles would be a reasonable step and would support the Council's Business Plan priority area of supporting the local economy to recover post-pandemic.

Agreed.

Any newly licensed vehicle must be ULEV or Zero emission from 1 December 2021

Members discussed at length the results of the combined CCC/SCDC project and heard how of the 17 proposed sites for charging points in the District, none were progressed, and all charging

points were installed in the City. Further discussions will need to take place to review the situation, and raise awareness of the lack of charging points, and promote our Green to the Core agenda. In light of this, and the high cost of drivers having to switch to an ULEV/zero emission vehicle so close to the pandemic, Members

Agreed it was appropriate to move the implementation date to 1 December 2023.
