



Linton Parish Council has 14 Councillors.

The Parish Council would like to purchase and install a commemoration bench with a plaque to mark the Queen's Jubilee. This will be in conjunction with the inclusivity project to improve access to the village centre for all ages. The bench will be placed near the Cathodeon Centre at the eastern side of the village, and it is hoped this will also provide much needed seating as a resting place to improve accessibility to the centre of the village for elderly and disabled residents, linking into the ongoing inclusivity project. The Cathodeon Centre has a high footfall as it houses the village library and Chestnut playgroup so is an ideal location. The bench would be an anti-vandal bench to ensure that it lasts and is at a reduced risk of being damaged, making it a long-lasting monument within the village and will benefit all parishioners. This will benefit the parishioners from Linton Parish as well as any visitors from surrounding Parishes.



The total cost of the project is £858 ex VAT and £700 is being requested through the Community Chest. A Local Contractor that carries out work for Linton Parish Council will carry out the installation. The remaining balance of the project will be funding by the Parish Council in its entirety

Whaddon Village Hall & Recreation Ground Trust was set up in 2011 and its eight members ensure the provision and maintenance of a village hall, recreation ground and play area for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Whaddon. The village hall is used for meetings, classes, coffee mornings, village social events and other forms of recreation and leisure interests. The recreation ground and playground are used for all forms of sport, recreation and leisure time occupations and are very popular with residents from the surrounding villages as well as from Whaddon

The Trust would like to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee with a lasting commemorative item alongside the various events that they are organising for the Jubilee bank holiday weekend

The play area and recreation ground are very popular and feedback from users is that more picnic benches would be appreciated - currently there are two. Grant funding is therefore requested for a picnic bench for the recreation ground as it will be useful, well-used, accessible to all and will enhance the existing facilities.

The bench will be made from recycled plastic has been chosen as it will match the existing benches, is environmentally responsible and will require little maintenance. A commemorative plague will also be attached to the bench.

The total cost of the bench of £614.40 is being requested from the Community chest:

- Recycled plastic bench- £384
- ground fixings- £28
- commemorative plaque- £50
- delivery- £50
- VAT-£102.40

The Parish Council wish to undertake a refurbishment of the pavilion in the upcoming years. They would like to include a seated area by the pavilion and recreational ground for all to come and enjoy the space. This grant is being applied for just one section of the refurbishment.

The recreation ground is an open space with no limit to who can come and use the outside facilities. By making improvements it will encourage other groups to use the area. In light of the current upcoming Jubilee celebrations, one improvement includes the provision of seated tables outside the pavilion and around the recreational ground. Funding is required for one of four picnic tables:

The cost of 4 Clifton Picnic Tables made from Enviropol Material is £3,090.29 and £700 has been requested through the Community Chest. The Parish Council has confirmed that they can cover the remaining costs via other sources.

#### **Cllr Claire Daunton:**

All Saints' Church, Croydon dates back to 1534 and is a focal point for the village. In addition to services, there is always a Food Box in the church for those in need. Recently, a Book Exchange point has been set up in the church for the community.

The church would like to place a Queen's Jubilee commemorative bench in the lower churchyard. There are less than half a dozen burials in the churchyard and meanwhile it is being developed as a biodiversity meadow; for which they have received the Cambridge Churchyard Conservation Scheme Bronze Award. # Wimpole Parish Council currently has 5 members

To celebrate the Platinum Jubilee the Parish Council would like to install a Queens Jubilee 'Meet and Greet' bench in the village (on the A603) to encourage residents to meet up and talk. The bench will be installed on a wide grass verge which is accessible to pedestrians using the A603. The proposed location is probably the only place in the village where a bench could be located as it has the widest grass verge. There is already a notice board and bin there and permission is currently being sought from the Local Highway Officer to add a bench. Toft Historical Society was formed in 2001 and exists to research, record and preserve all aspects of life in Toft. The Society and its activities are open to everyone in village and surrounding community. Through organised activities, locals can learn about the village's historical development, its buildings, its environment, and its social life from its earliest origins (the village is recorded in the Domesday Book) to the present day.

The society also works with other village groups and the Parish Council to commemorate relevant historical events, such as the Queen's Jubilees. They also hold historical exhibitions and public lectures and in 2013 collaborated with the University of Cambridge on a Time Team 'Big Dig' across the village.

In 2018 the Historical Society received a Community Chest contribution to help mark their status as a Thankful Village through the installation of a memorial stone and information board alongside their World War II Memorial. This is seen and appreciated by the community and the many people passing through Toft.

Funds to support activities are raised through their popular public lectures and through grant applications

To mark the Queens Platinum Jubilee, the Society are organising four days of activities in June in conjunction with their annual Spring Feast. This will include the lighting of Beacons and organising a Village Street Party. There are various other events takin place including royal-themed activities for children, a history exhibition and public lecture, maypole dancing, well dressing, music, a parish boundary walk/picnic, and a joint church/chapel service before a traditional village tea on the Sunday.

To provide a lasting record of the Jubilee, the Society intend to relocate their beacon to a new, more accessible area and plant a Platinum Jubilee tree, accompanied by a commemorative plaque.

#### The Beacon:

The existing village beacon is located on the Greenwich Meridian where it was first installed to celebrate the Millennium. For the upcoming Jubilee the Parish Council has agreed that the fire basket can be moved to the community land on the east side of the village which can accommodate a larger audience, provide better access for disabled members of the village, and facilitate safer operation of the Beacon. The current Beacon pole and commemorative plaque will remain where it is with its to continue to mark the Millennium event.

#### **Platinum Jubilee Tree:**

A commemorative tree will be planted on an area of land alongside our small Village Green. This area of land is currently heavily overgrown, including a sizeable field maple which tree surgeons have confirmed has died. The Parish Council have approved the professional removal of this tree and the clearance of the surrounding area which will increase the overall area of the green and so help improve this central location in the village for the benefit of the community.

This application is for £500- which is the cost needed to commission a bronze plaque from a local sculptor to go with the new tree. This plaque will incorporate the winning design from a village competition.

The Parish Council have agreed to fund the £600 needed for the removal of the existing dead tree and necessary ground clearance whilst the Toft Historical Society will purchase the commemorative tree for £80.

Balsham Trinity Church Flower Arrangers Group was started in 1970 and consists of 21 volunteers that keep the village church decked with flowers throughout the year paying particular attention to religious Festivals. Every other year they hold a large flower festival to raise funds for the church.

Volunteers normally pay for all the flowers themselves and for that reason the group do not have a bank account.

The arrangements for the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations will be depicting events that have happened during the Queen's 7 decades. 14 flower arrangers are taking part and some of the ideas include:

1950s – Coronation

1960s - Swinging sixties, The Beatles, Landing on the Moon, World Cup

1970s - Punk, Decimalisation, the UK joining the EU, The Silver Jubilee

1980s - Diana and Charles wedding, Thatcher

1990s - Harry Potter, The Spice Girls

2000 - Millennium, Garden parties, President Obama being elected

2010 - The Olympics

2020 - The NHS, Covid

Volunteers will use foliage from their gardens, but the flowers will be bought for these arrangements and not grown by the volunteers.

The wider community (Balsham, Great Abington, Little Abington, Hildersham, Weston Colville, West Wratting, West Wickham)) will benefit from the Platinum Jubilee displays and it will be advertised widely. Running alongside the display in the church there will be film footage of events from the Queen's era and also old films. There will also be tea and cakes on sale provided by the Balsham WI. At the moment this is the only event organised in Balsham for the Platinum Jubilee.

The total project cost is ~£600 and the Parish Council have already contributed £300:

Whittlesford Parish Church, established on 1022, is one of the centres of spiritual life in the village. It is also the centre of community support. For instance, during the pandemic, it was the Vicar who organised a support network of volunteers. The Church is registered with the Diocese of Ely.

2022 is a very special year for Whittlesford. As well as celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, the village are marking one thousand years of the Parish Church. The Church will be organising a Village Party, with a music festival, for local charities and organisations to attend and raise money. In addition, they have arranged a "History Week" of lectures and events at the church, for children and adults, all free. Several "1000 mile" village challenges of walking, running and cycling have also been completed and a new stained-glass window will be installed in the church; hopefully without asking the village for financial support.

The Church would like to give every child, of primary school age, in the village a commemorative mug bearing the logo of our "2022 1000" celebrations and a suitable insignia for the Jubilee. There are 201 pupils in our village William Westley Church of England Primary School, and it is estimated to be 60 other children, of primary school age, who attend other schools.
