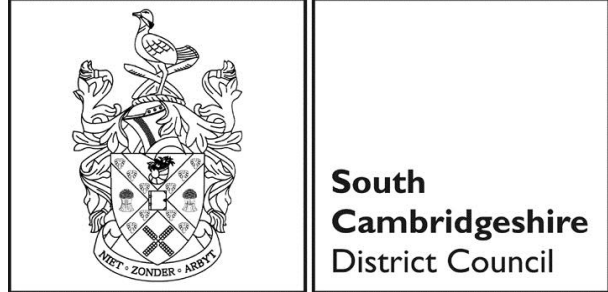


# Whistleblowing concern form
