What is the matter which is shortly to be considered and in respect of which you seek a dispensation?

All matters relating to working with Barton Recreation Improvement Group (BRIG) to provide facilities in the village for recreation and other leisure time occupations. This will include

**seeking funding for a new Sports and Social Pavilion;
consideration of grants to the project from the Parish precept;
involvement in planning applications and overseeing building work;
eventual contractual, management and licensing matters.**

What is the nature of your prejudicial interest?

I am a member of the Barton Recreation Ground Improvement Group (BRIG), a charity (No. 1130968) set up to improve the provision of recreation and leisure facilities in the village, and also a Parish Councillor.
