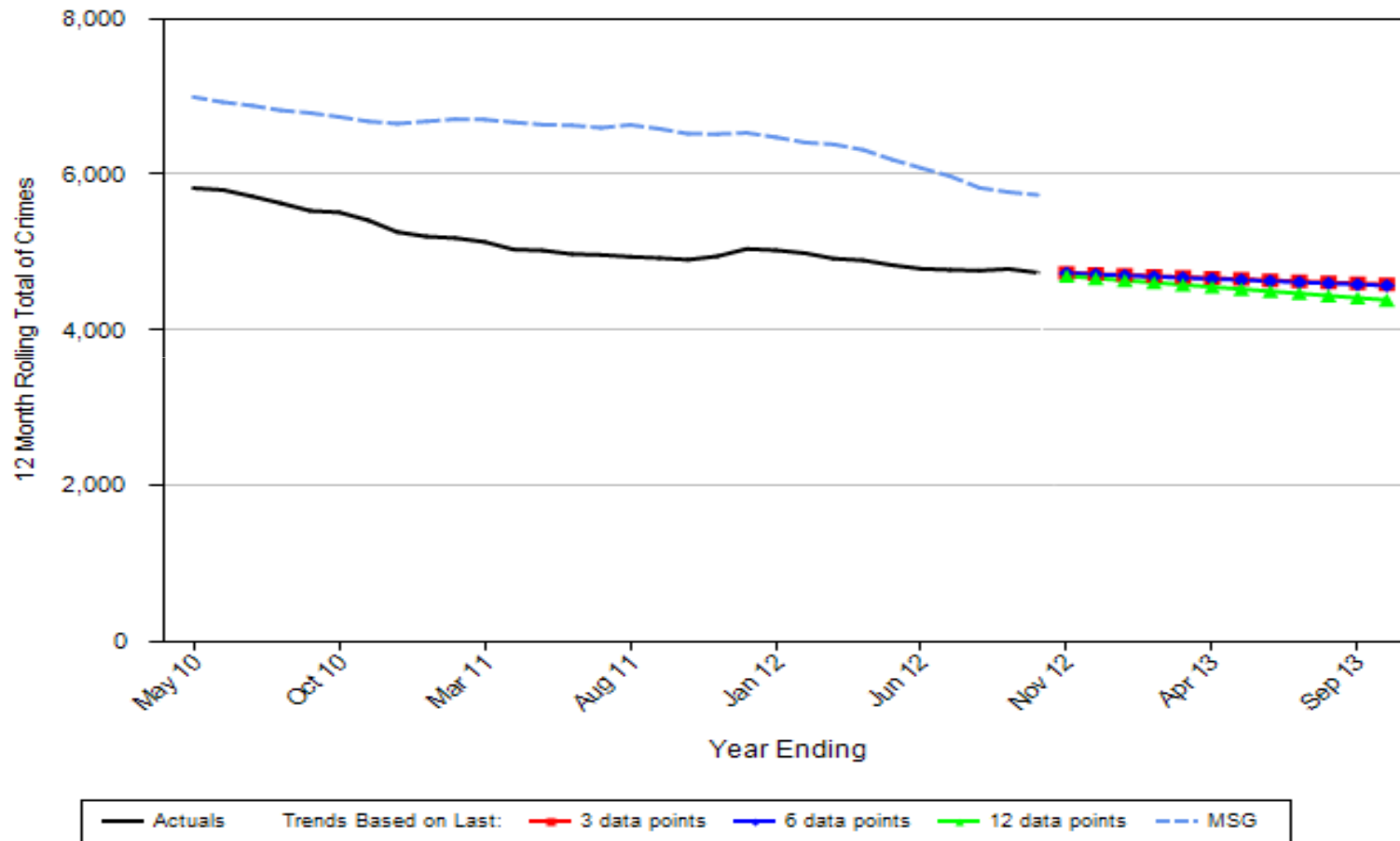

Key Findings - overview

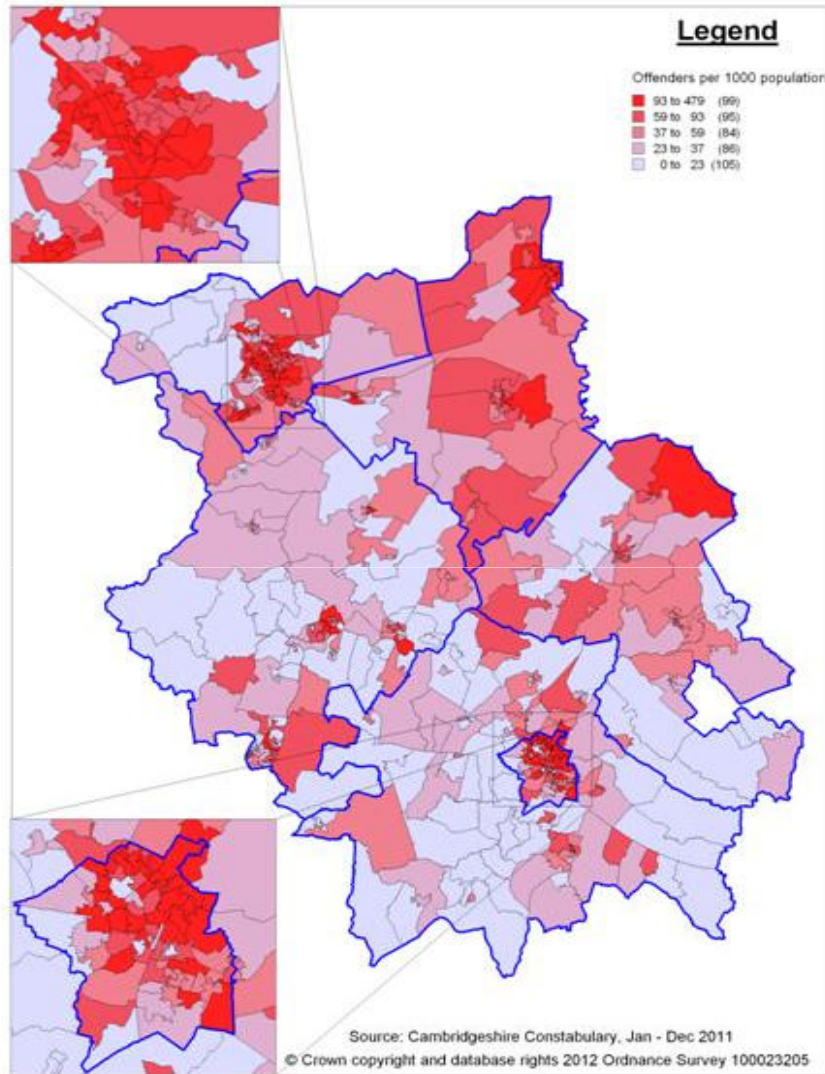


- Large rural district

- Position 3 of 15 – Most Similar Group

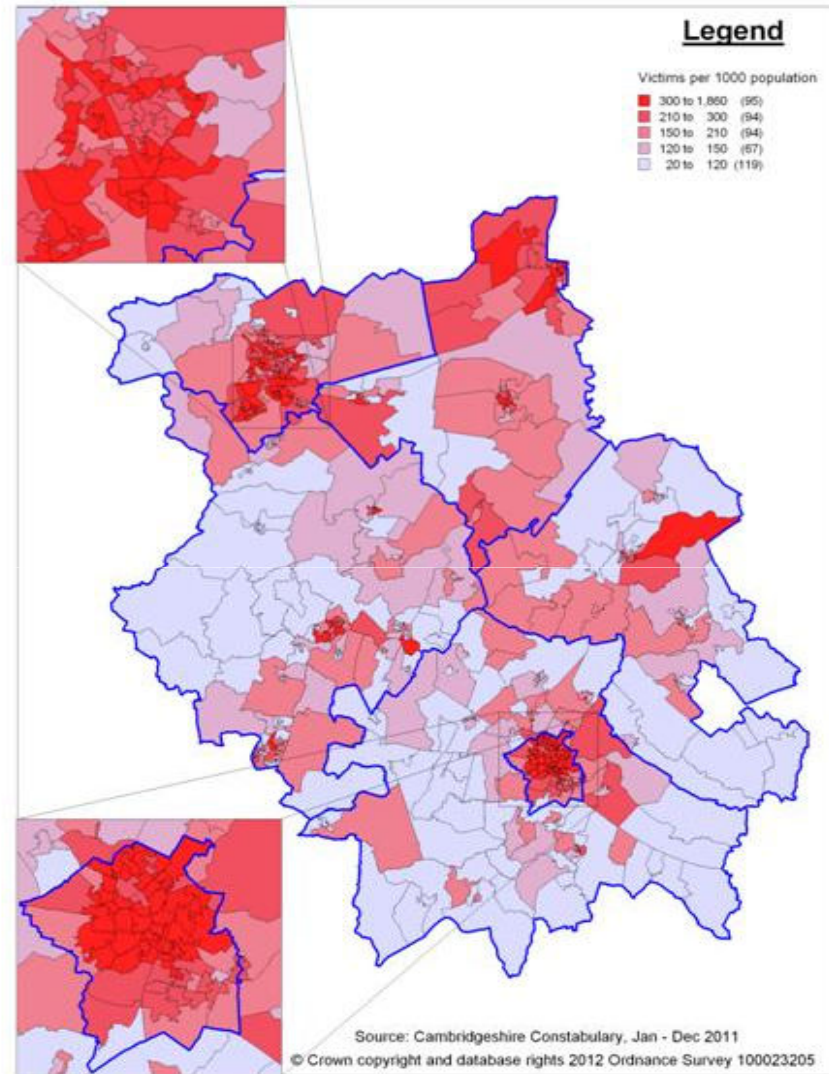
Total Crime Trend

Anti-Social Behaviour

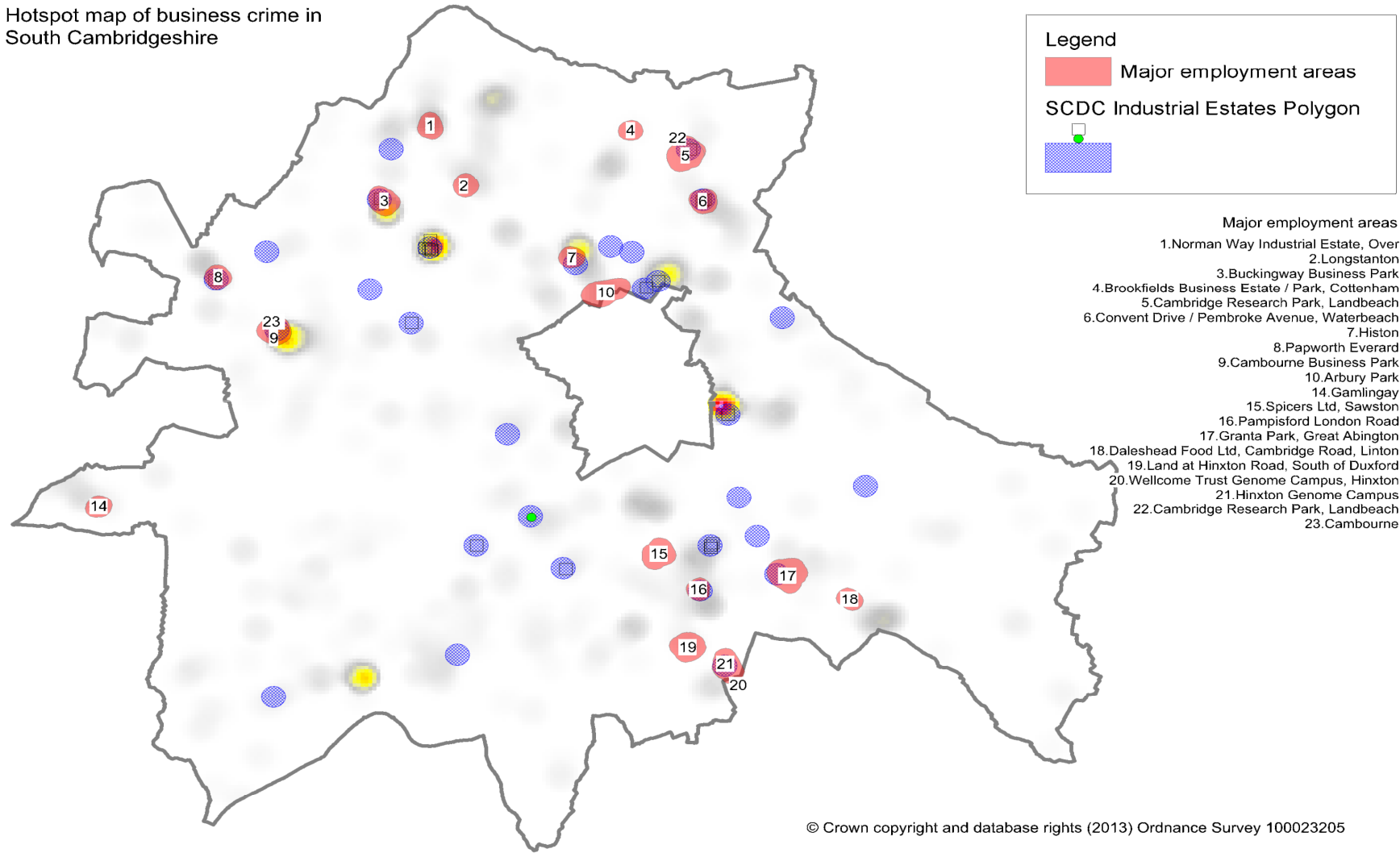

Crimes against Businesses

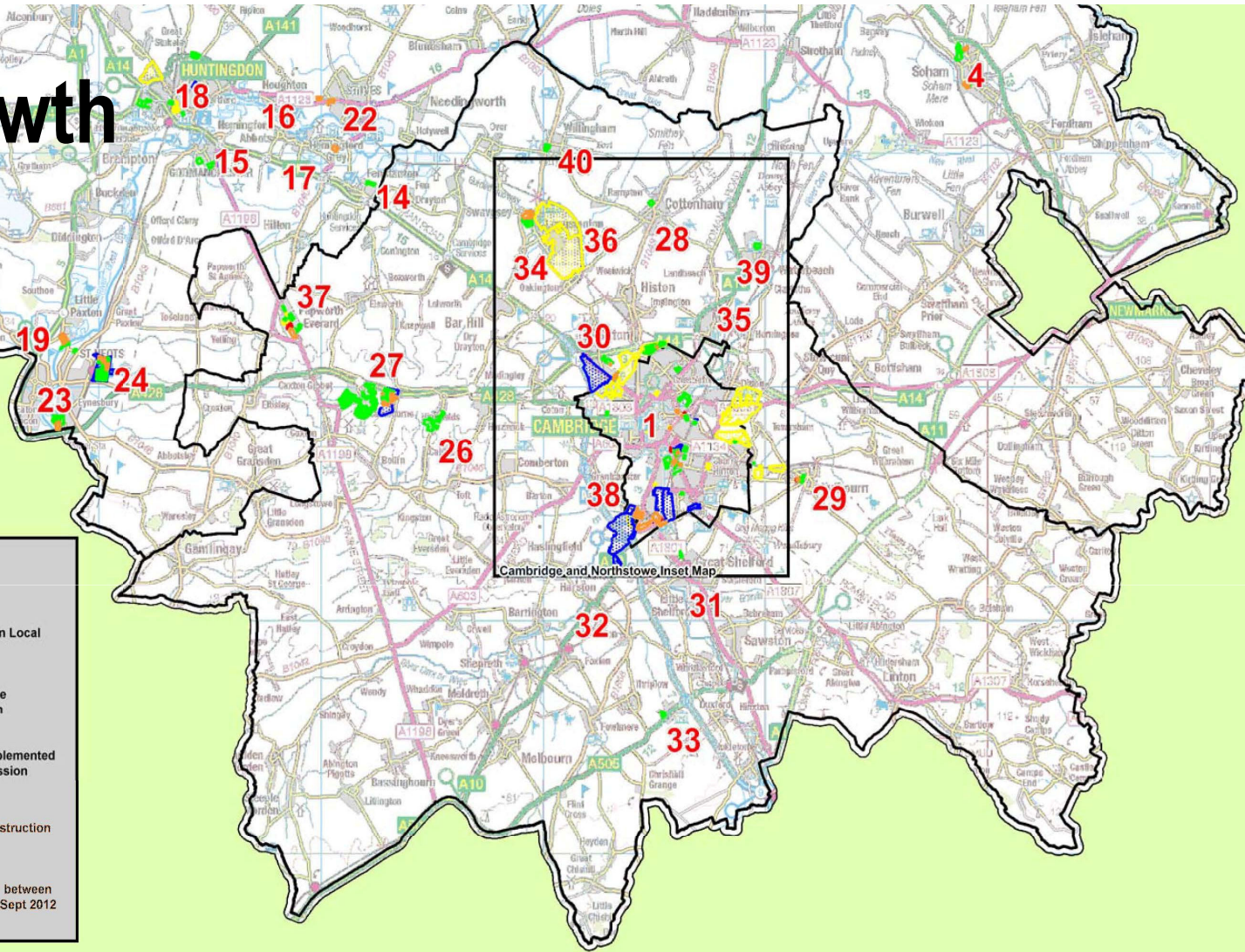
Hotspot map of business crime in South Cambridgeshire



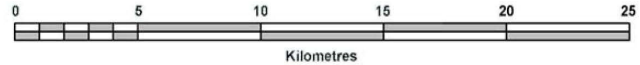
