School bookings are up which is thanks to hard work by Chris the education officer, family days are up and this is partly to do with families in Landbeach, Waterbeach, and Chittering being offered discounted family tickets. Even though then families are getting in cheaper they do tend to spend in the shop and café which does increase the income by more than is lost with the discount offer. Plus people tend to come back again after an initial visit.

Bookings for talks and reminiscent sessions have also risen.

The new HLF bid will be going in based on the 2013 bid but with additions, it is thought that this will hopefully bring success.

There have been meetings with Jo Mills to discuss the business plan and this is all going well with everyone happy.

Education Report – 10th April 2014

School Groups

Figures this quarter have shown an improvement. To some extent this is a matter of luck, as one large booking can make a significant difference. This large booking was with Waterbeach Primary with whom we are striking up a good relationship, and there have been a number of contacts of different types over the last year.

The new curriculum does not as yet seem to have made a great impact, and schools are continuing to book their old (soon to be forbidden) favourites, rather than take up our offer of new topics. However we feel we are well prepared for any schools who do want to use us, especially for the Local History element. One innovation that has started to take off is whole day outreach visits to schools. This works out much cheaper for the schools than a visit here, which may be unfortunate in terms of attracting visitors to the museum, but at least it keeps our numbers up.

Family Days

The figures have shown an encouraging rise. Twilight took us all by surprise and we had twice as many visitors as last year. The other sessions have also shown a modest improvement, perhaps because we have revamped the programme, including changing days from Tuesday to Wednesday. Ann Biggs and her team have taken over much of the
