Will Bevan (Acting Chairman) would like to express our sincere thanks to Zoe Burton for all the effort she devoted to the Parish whilst Chairman of the Longstowe Parish Council. She will be a very hard act to replace, and we wish her well in 2013.

An important item on the agenda for April will be a recommendation to change the speed limits in the Parish: changing from 40 to 30 mph within the village on the B1046 and changing from 60 to 50 mph from the village sign to the north of the village on the A1198 to the 40 mph limit just before the crossroads.

In order for these changes to take place, the village must raise some or all of the costs involved. Unfortunately it will be April before we are informed of the likely costs. It would be useful if local people could inform the Councillors of their feelings on the matter. Please write to the Clerk or any of the Councillors if you are unable to attend the meeting.

#### **Floodlighting the Church Tower**

Some of the responses to the PCC following the article in the Skylark during 2010 on floodlighting the Church Tower confirmed to us the fact that a small number of the community would still like to floodlight the church if sufficient money is available for this purpose.

The funds raised as long as go as 2004, have continued to be carefully invested and ring fenced in the PCC' accounts. As a result they have grown but as mentioned in the Skylark article of 2010; the monies held have always fallen well short of the total likely to be required to complete the project. Interest received on the monies to hand, is well below the level at which costs are rising.

Readers may recall that a request was made in the aforementioned article for anyone prepared to either provide the remaining funds (something to the order of £2000/£3000 plus running costs) to carry out this project themselves or to raise funds for this purpose.

To date no volunteers have come forward to this request, and we are again asking for your thoughts/comments. Flood lighting of a church requires permission from the Church Diocese. Several issues have come to the fore when Churches have applied to the Authorities for floodlighting, mainly concerning environmental issues (and confirmation re certainty of meeting future running costs). For Longstowe the primary issues which would have to be answered in applying for permission are:

- Disturbance to our legally protected colony of brown long eared bats which inhabit the church. Under the Wildlife and Countryside Act it is a criminal offence to disturb these bats in any way. Elsewhere floodlighting has been shown seriously to disturb their feeding behaviour.
- Question of light pollution.
- Also, as the Church is some distance from the majority of potential viewers, by virtue of its location, and further, is largely hidden by the trees which surround it, is there any benefit in floodlighting when compared to other floodlit churches?

Fundraising, whatever the circumstance is not easy, especially so in these financially troubled times and, combined with the above, makes this potential project additionally problematic. We may find ourselves raising funds for a purpose which cannot ever happen. #### **Letter from Fiona**

Did you know that the world produces enough food for everyone, but not everyone has enough food? Every day 1 in 8 people go hungry. That is the equivalent of the populations of the UK, and all the other European countries, the USA, Canada AND Australia, all going to bed hungry tonight.

In 2013 the UK is hosting the G8 Summit and so, many churches and organisations are running a campaign to ask our government to put hunger on the agenda at the G8.

The **ENOUGH FOOD FOR EVERYONE IF** campaign will focus on some of the root causes of hunger, recognising that aid is only a vital first step in tackling global poverty, and that we should go beyond it to the deeper causes of poverty and hunger, like climate change and tax dodging. During the year there will be campaigning actions on:

- **Keeping Finance Promises.** Asking our government to keep its promises to give 0.7% of GDP as aid, and with other rich countries, to provide the money they have already promised to help poor communities adapt to climate change.
- **Land.** Stopping companies and governments grabbing land from poor communities who can't prove they own it,

and changing the EU biofuel target that makes land grabs more profitable and pushes up food prices.

- **Tax.** Stopping tax dodging by multinational companies, so they pay more tax in poor countries where they operate and poor countries' governments can spend it on tackling poverty.
- **Transparency.** Making the governments of poor countries more accountable to their people for how they use their budgets, and multinational food companies to be more accountable for their food stocks and food prices.

I am very proud to say that many of the Papworth Team churches will be taking part in this campaign leading up to the G8 summit and all churches have information packs available for you to use and read more information. **DIOCESE of ELY NOTICE OF  
PREPARATION OF NEW CHURCH  
ELECTORAL ROLL PARISH OF: St Mary  
The Virgin, Longstowe**

Notice is hereby given that under the Church Representation Rules a new Church Electoral Roll is being prepared. All persons who wish to have their names entered on the new Roll whether their names are entered on the present Roll or not, are requested to apply for enrolment not later than the **3rd day of April 2013**. The new Roll will come into operation on the **5th day of April 2013**.

The new Roll shall be published for not less than 14 days. Forms of application for enrolment can be obtained from the undersigned. In order to be entitled to attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting and to take part in its proceedings, forms of application for enrolment must be returned by the earlier of the dates given above.

Under the Church Representation Rules any persons are entitled to have their names entered on the roll, if they –

- (1) are baptised and aged 16 or over;
- (2) have signed a form of application for enrolment;

and either

- (3) are members of the Church of England or of any Church in communion with the Church of England being resident in the parish<sup>2</sup> or (not being resident in the parish) having habitually attended public worship in the parish during the six months prior to the application for enrolment;

or

- (4) are members in good standing of a Church (not in communion with the Church of England) which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity declaring themselves to be also members of the Church of England and having habitually attended public worship in the parish during the period of six months prior to enrolment.

Any error discovered in the roll should at once be reported to the undersigned.



## Village News

### **Longstowe Bells are back in action!**

Our church has a set of eight Harringtons Tubular bells. They have hung in the tower since 1898 and have seen use for more than a century. There are around 300 sets of Harringtons bells remaining around the U.K. Due to wear, tear and ageing ours have been unusable for a number of years, until now.

All this has changed due to a very generous donation made to the church for the purpose of restoring this fine bellframe to working order. This donation, made by Mr and Mrs Vic Jarvis has enabled us to buy sufficient new parts to restore the bellframe to original function, on a like for like basis including the leather straps which are an integral part of the chiming mechanism. Parts have been made for us, and much useful advice were obtained from Nicholson Engineering (Bell hangers and Engineers) in Bridport. We are very pleased with the excellent service we received from them. The bells can now be rung, as originally, from the frame at the base of the tower.



The restoration work was carried out by myself and my stepson, Andrew Atkinson, between Christmas day and the New Year. Our first 'performance' was held in the first week of January in honour of Mr and Mrs Jarvis who braved the cold to come and have a listen. Mr Clay kindly brought along a bottle of something appropriate and a few glasses! A number of onlookers appeared who joined in a short, chilly, but very jolly occasion.

It is hoped that we will be able to have a group of bell ringers who, between them, will be able to provide ringing for most of our services. ### ***Village Hall outside lighting***

A number of residents have thoughtfully reported to The Committee, that the outside lighting is sometimes 'on' at times when it is not necessary. This situation has arisen because the sensors which control the operation of the outside lights have deteriorated and need to be replaced to restore correct function. To do this would cost the Village Hall around £250. As the outside lights are all of the low energy type, actual power consumption is very low. At a practical level, we would have to spend around £250 to save perhaps £5 per year. The current decision is to leave things as they are, whilst monitoring the situation. It may be borne in mind that lighting coming on at unexpected times may assist security.

### ***Longstowe Village Show, 2013***

Our long running Village Show is to be back this year. It will be held in September, in conjunction with Longstowe Village Fête, details of which appear elsewhere in Skylark.

In order to keep our show lively and accessible to as large a number of entrants, we are rearranging the classes into groups which we feel will be more appropriate to everyday life in current times, than 15 years ago. We are ensuring that there will be plenty of opportunity for youngsters to enter with things they have made and with photographs.

### ***Longstowe New Village Hall and Sports Pavilion Project***

Back in May 2012 a public invitation was sent to the people of Longstowe inviting them to an open meeting to discuss the proposal that a new village hall and sports pavilion be built. Following on from this, a sub-committee of the Village Hall Committee was established with the purpose of pursuing the objectives of raising plans and sourcing funding for a new building.

Meeting on an evening over a period of time and liaising with the Parish Council and the Village Hall Committee, the sub-committee defined the concept of the new building. It was felt that the design should be wholly compatible with the environment in which it is located; that it should be ecologically

sound and therefore economically viable by using efficient and reusable energy sources as well as adequate insulation. Discussion took place regarding the financial sustainability of the premises and that this would be as it is now, through generated income from fees paid by users, but on an increased scale. A slightly larger building would have a greater potential and wider scope for attracting users and thereby hirers. For instance, by having two changing rooms, complete with showers, rather than one, and including a referee's room, more team sports can occur; not only cricket throughout the summer, but also soccer or hockey in the winter months when the pitch would normally be unused. It was also thought that a modestly larger hall would almost certainly attract a range of interest from keep-fit or dance classes. In order to ensure the hall is used during the day time, there is undoubtedly a case for inviting the hall to become a venue for those with a particular need; for example, children in the area who are carers and need some respite and an opportunity to meet with others who have similar responsibilities. The hall could also host activities for the elderly or as a meeting place for young parents. Of course the Village Hall Committee is open to suggestions regarding the use of the premises, but it is especially hoped that the current users, who have been so important in enabling the hall to pay its way, will continue to use it as a venue of choice. Naturally, the hall is a place where many of the Longstowe community and their friends meet for a range of events including Quiz Nights, the Harvest Supper and the Summer and Christmas Fairs, to name a few, and so it is imperative that as well as providing for a modern kitchen the plans include a bar and, most importantly, much improved toilets. Another consideration the sub-committee took into account is that the Parish Council, as well as the Village Hall Committee, presently meet in what is actually a team changing room, and so an allocation of space has been designated on the plan as a meeting room, but which could also be a resource room for council and local information (some will remember that Longstowe once had a Reading Room in the village...). Finally, but not least, the need for internal storage has also been facilitated, after which we will be able to say farewell to the less than beautiful containers that fail to blend into the otherwise idyllic landscape.

So where are we now with regards to this vision for a new hall and sports pavilion? Well, presently we stand beyond the notion of defining its concept. The design brief needed to take into account the matter of cost and

this was reflected by the purpose of the hall in relation to the size of Longstowe itself. We sought to create a hall that provided all of the above, but not beyond. Unlike the impressive and award winning Eco-Hub community centre at Gamlingay, which supports a much larger community than ours, we had to take into account the funds that might be considered reasonable for a village the size of Longstowe. To date, we have commissioned and obtained the design plans and once approved by the Village Hall Committee and the Parish Council, we are one step away from applying for planning permission. In parallel with this development we have informed our district councillors, as well as made contact and forged links with various fund providers. The Bevan family, who actually own the land upon which hall is built, have kindly agreed to extend the current lease if necessary, despite there being a good many years remaining. The sub-committee has also engaged the services of a professional consultant on a phase-by-phase basis to provide technical advice and guidance. We have also received invaluable advice from Councillor Bridget Smith who is largely credited with steering the creation of the Eco-Hub from its concept to completion. This means that we are virtually at the point of applying a strategy for fundraising. This vital next phase will take place at a time of increased financial austerity; therefore the task of raising funds will not be easy and is likely to take quite some time.

A recent SCDC audit on village facilities in South Cambridgeshire identifies Longstowe as being poorly resourced. We therefore hope this will be one factor that will strengthen our case when applying for funding. Above all, although comparatively small, we are a thriving community and wish to continue being so. We therefore believe we have a compelling case and a justifiable need. It is hoped that the Village Hall Committee can count on your support in delivering this project as speedily as possible for the benefit and enjoyment of all.

## **Longstowe Sports Club**

### ***Longstowe Cricket Club***

With the days starting to lengthen it at last seems that we are emerging from winter and can look forward to the summer ahead. This is especially true for the Cricket Club as we make preparations for the coming season.

Although there are records of occasional matches played in the village during the 1800s the Cricket Club can trace its formal beginnings to the period immediately after the

1st World War. In that era even the smallest village seemed to have its own side and would play against neighbouring villages in one of the small local leagues. Longstowe was no exception, playing in the Milton & District league and the Christmas Challenge Cup.

It was only after the 2nd World War (in 1952) that the club entered the County-wide CCA Junior League. In the seasons that followed they rose through the Divisions until their crowning glory in 1961 when they won the Junior league and were promoted to the Senior League. Sadly their stay only lasted one season before they were relegated back to the Junior Leagues where they have remained ever since. Along the way they have enjoyed some successes including the Lower Junior Cup in 2003.

In 1977 the Club entered a 2nd XI into the Minor League. This was helped in part by the arrival of several youngsters from the recently disbanded Arrington Cricket Club. In 1979 the 2nd team won the Minor League and followed the 1st XI into the CCA Junior league. At their peak they reached Division 2 and went through the summer of 2004 unbeaten.

Since those early days many of the surrounding Villages have lot their Cricket sides while we keep going. For 2013 the Club has again entered two sides into the CCA Junior Leagues. However in these days when there are so many alternative distractions and occupations it is always a struggle to field teams so we are always keen to find new faces. If you are interested in playing a little cricket (or know someone who is) – perhaps you played in the past and drifted away from the sport – then why not give it a try. Enthusiasm is every bit as important as ability so all are welcome.

We play 40 over matches on a Saturday afternoon through the summer (May onwards), starting at 1.30pm and finishing around 7pm. Pre-season Nets have been arranged at Fenners for 3 Wednesday evenings between 8 and 9pm. (March 27th, April the 3rd and April the 10th) and thereafter there will be informal net sessions at the ground on Thursday evenings.

### **More Choice in Social Care**

Social care is provided to people who have been assessed as having substantial or critical support needs with personal care, getting meals, managing medication and staying safe.

If you need social care the County Council will arrange your care for you, but they now have a duty to offer and provide Direct Payments. Direct Payments are an alternative way of getting the care and support you need. They are cash payments made directly into a Direct Payment bank account so that you can use the money to make your own social care arrangements.

With a Direct Payment you have more choice, control and independence about how your care is organised. ### **Revolutionary Chainsaw design**

News has leaked out, from one of the major manufacturers of chainsaws (the orange and grey ones) that due to tightening legislation on use of fossil fuels and emissions to the atmosphere, the days of the two stroke small engine, notoriously inefficient though cheap to build and maintain, are numbered.

One practical answer to this problem appears to be virtually ready for sale. This well established company has just released details, but no photos, of the World's first solar powered chainsaw. It is to be introduced initially in small and medium sizes with a special coating on the blade, to reduce friction to previously unheard of levels. This is necessary to maximise efficiency and running time. The saw's near silent motor is powered by a solar cell around the size of a postcard attached to the safety helmet and visor which is sold with it. As the unit runs so quietly, to help avoid accidents, the saw is also supplied with a safety jacket incorporating an inbuilt flexible wire mesh which would carry the current from the solar cells to the saw and incorporate a safety feature. Should the saw contact the sleeve of the jacket, a fuse blows and the saw stops immediately. There are also solar cells mounted on the shoulders of the jacket. Clearly the chainsaw won't work in the dark, but good light is necessary for this kind of work anyway. Tests have been carried out in the cold and poor light levels far north, in the forests to the north of Reykjavik. Production, following these successful tests is scheduled to start early next month. My source hasn't revealed the top secret name of this unit yet, still known by its development code, 010413.

Won't be long before we are all talking about 010413!
