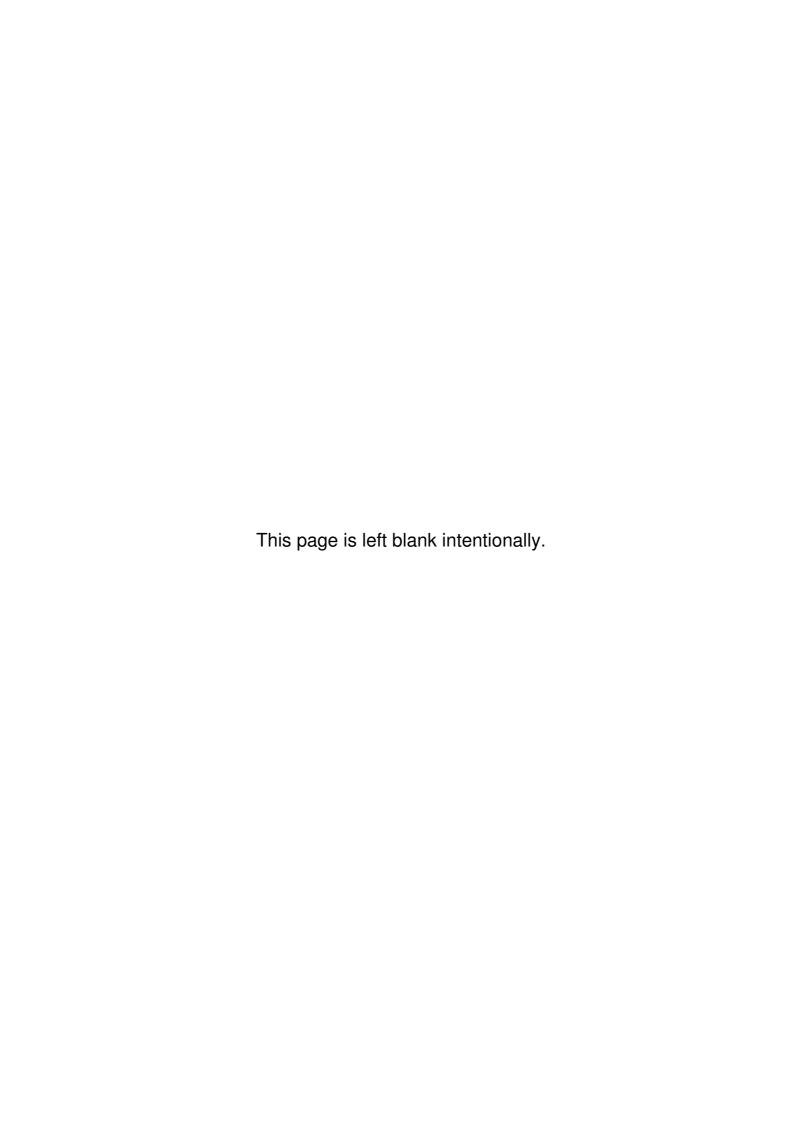

## **Priority Area Quarterly Progress Report: Q1 2009/10**

Priority Area: ASB

Lead Officer: Insp Chris Savage

### Key Achievements during this Quarter<sup>1</sup>

• The group dealt with 12 newly referred cases in Q1

- Two ASBOs and Three Acceptable Behaviour Contracts were issued during the quarter
- Dedicated Problem Solving Groups were held to develop solutions to three specific cases demonstrating a partnership orientated problem solving approach to ASB case resolution
- Attendance at ASB Task Group meetings and partner 'buy in' has improved since the last quarter
- Partnership working has led to the resolution of a number of ASB cases during the quarter and positive feedback from residents has been received through Neighborhood Panel meetings.
- The Streets programmes delivered to over 700 year 9 students at Linton, Bassingbourn, Comberton and Swavesey Village colleges

### Areas of Concern for Partnership to Note<sup>2</sup>

- Absence of the CDRP ASB caseworker due to sickness has impacted on performance and coordination.
- Under-use of YOS assistance in dealing with responses to case referrals

## Recommendations to Partnership to Address Concerns<sup>3</sup>

 YOS representatives will present at the August meeting to make other partners aware of the services they can offer in responding to case referrals.

#### Key Achievements during this Quarter<sup>1</sup>

- The calendar devised by student midwives was presented and the Task Group agreed that this should be presented to the Implementation Group.
- The Canadian Model training has taken place
- · Representatives from mental health will attend the next TG meeting
- Bridget Fairley's post at SCDC has been recruited to
- All magistrates in the Cambridge Court have now received DV Training which was reported as very beneficial

## Areas of Concern for Partnership to Note<sup>2</sup>

- The request for South Cambs to provide match funding for DV Awareness Day in 2009-10 needs consideration. £1,500 received from City. This is not sufficient however there is talk of having a countywide conference. This needs to be confirmed before planning work takes place.
- Whilst the training on the Canadian model has taken place Social Care Children's Teams do
  not have the resources to implement it. The Task Group is very concerned overall about the
  lack of resources in Children's Services.

- The Task Group asks that the concerns over the lack of resources in Children's Services is raised and taken to strategic groups to take further.
- That a decision be taken on the issue of DV Awareness Day funding.

#### 1. Key Achievements (What has gone well):

- **Enforcement:** A curfew condition was obtained on a Probation licence, restricting a PPO to his home address overnight and requiring them to present to a Police Officer on request. Regular checks were undertaken by Police Officers to ensure that this condition was complied with.
- **Enforcement:** A PPO was arrested and charged with breach of a recently obtained ASBO. This resulted in a custodial sentence
- Enforcement: A PPO was given a lengthy custodial sentence for armed robbery.
- Partnership Working: The early release on ECL of a PPO who proposed an unsuitable address for release was delayed, until a suitable address was agreed upon.
- Partnership Working: The early release from custody on ECL of a PPO was stopped, following objections on the grounds of their status and continuing harm to the community.
- Partnership Working: A condition was obtained on a Probation licence for a PPO to comply with any requirements specified by their supervising officer, for the purpose of ensuring that they address their alcohol offending, behaviour problems.
- **Prevention**: A 2-year ASBO was obtained for a PPO whose offending, drinking and anti-social behaviour has caused problems in the Fulbourn area.
- Prevention: A 3-year ASBO was obtained for a PPO whose anti-social behaviour and offending has caused problems in Girton and areas of Cambridge City.
- **Prevention:** The crime saved estimator shows that 13 crimes were saved to date in FY2009/10 (base level), 65 using the F multiplier (a close approximation to BCS).
- Rehabilitation & Resettlement: The PPO Officer is undertaking home visits and keeping in contact by telephone with a young PPO, in order to engage them in the scheme and avert their offending behaviour
- Rehabilitation & Resettlement: The PPO team are working in conjunction with the SCDC ASB PSG and the housing dept, in order to facilitate the move of 2 PPOs and their family members.
- Rehabilitation & Resettlement: Members of the PPO team attended the YOS Risk Panel meeting for a PPO, in order to discuss the interventions that can be put in place following their release from custody.

**Priority Area: Serious Acquisitive Crime** 

Lead Officer: Cllr John Reynolds

#### Key Achievements during this Quarter<sup>1</sup>

- Burglary & Vehicle Crime Task Group amalgamated into Serious Acquisitive Crime Task Group to streamline agendas.
- Significant reductions to SAC levels in Great Shelford and Linton. Great Shelford reductions are result of known persistent offender being given custodial sentence.
- As part of Police Trading Standards partnership work, Bobby Scheme reps are asking all burglary
  victims that they visit if they have had any door-step sellers or cold callers at their home prior to the
  offence taking place (either Burglary/ Distraction Burglary or Rogue Trading) so that it can be
  determined if there are links between these incidents. Police are funding increased patrols in
  distraction burglary hot-spot areas.
- Operation Promenade 2009 In specific hot-spot areas a Bobby Scheme rep will be working using
  information from Cambridgeshire Police to upgrade security for those residents who may be
  vulnerable or at risk of distraction burglary.
- A database of community contacts is being compiled for South Cambs villages to include Residents Groups, Lunch Clubs, Meals on Wheels, Neighbourhood Watch, Housing Societies, etc. This list will then be used to disseminate information and awareness messages regarding Distraction Burglary and Rogue Trading as appropriate.
- Police have completed purchases of Smart Water kits and wish to thank CDRP for swift response
  on granting of funding for this.
- Change in PPO matrix guidelines has allowed three more known burglary offenders to be added to PPO scheme list.
- Trading Standards reported that HomeShield scheme is working well 13 cases in South Cambs successfully referred to other partners for services required during Q1. Training sessions for partner reps very well subscribed, which bodes well for extending the scope of the scheme.

#### Areas of Concern for Partnership to Note<sup>2</sup>

- Spikes in incidences in Cottenham, Willingham, Bourn and Cambourne Cambs Police have identified offenders believed to be responsible for this activity and are pursuing investigations.
- The County CSO was going to facilitate meeting between SACTG members and County Magistrates
  to discuss sentencing policy. This has lapsed with previous post holder leaving and group feel it
  would be very beneficial to schedule this ASAP.

#### Recommendations to Partnership to Address Concerns<sup>3</sup>

• Explore possibility of scheduling meeting between SACTG and Magistrates to discuss sentencing policy.
