Thursday 14 March, Independent: Climate risks warning

Efforts to make the UK resilient to the impacts of climate change fall "far short" of what is needed, independent advisers have warned.

Friday 15 March, Guardian: Heat pump scheme delayed

The Government's scheme to increase the installation of heat pumps to replace gas boilers has been delayed until next year.

Sunday 17 March, BBC Online: Abuse and harassment of councillors

Local politicians are facing unprecedented levels of abuse and harassment, with LGA research showing that in 2023, 82 per cent of councillors fell at risk at least some of the time while fulfilling their role, up from 73 per cent the previous year.

Over the past five months, BBC Panorama has followed Havering Council as it has struggled to balance its books.


Monday 18 March, Guardian: UK heat pump rollout

A report by the National Audit Office (NAO) has found that heat pump installations would need to accelerate 11-fold if the Government is to reach its target for 600,000 heat pumps installed in homes every year by 2028.

A record 142,000 children in England are homeless and living in what should be short term accommodation, including in B&Bs and hotels, former office blocks and shipping containers, some without a bed their own.

7. View Planning Applications



To view the list of planning applications that have recently been submitted to the Council, please visit the authority's on-line <u>Planning</u> <u>Application Search</u>.

The system will provide a range of information on current and decided applications since 1948, including a brief description of the development, reference number, decision and the date of decision. More recent applications show the name and telephone number of the council officer who is dealing with the application.

Search results are presented in a collection of pages, the number of which depends on the number of results your search produces. There are navigation tools to allow you to browse your results.

Executive Decisions Taken Since Wednesday 13 March 2024



In accordance with the Access to Information
Procedure Rules in Part 4 of the Council's
Constitution, any executive decision shall be
published normally within five days of being made.
That record will bear the date on which it is published and will specify that the decision will come into force, and may then be implemented, on the expiry of 5 working days after the publication of the decision, unless called in for review by the Chairman of the Scrutiny and Overview Committee or by any five other councillors.

A list of decisions currently within the call-in period is available on the Council's website.

The call in procedure is set out in full in <u>Part 4 of the Council's Constitution</u>, 'Scrutiny and Overview Committee Procedure Rules'.

B) that delegated authority is given to the Joint Director for Planning and Economic Development to agree any minor amendments to the response in order to finalise the joint response.


