

### Executive Decisions Taken Since Wednesday ...



In accordance with the <u>Access to Information</u> <u>Procedure Rules in Part 4 of the Council's</u> <u>Constitution</u>, any executive decision shall be published normally within five days of being made. That record will bear the date on which it is published and will specify that the decision will come into force, and may then be implemented, on the expiry of 5 working days after the publication of the decision, unless called in for review by the Chairman of the Scrutiny and Overview Committee or by any five other councillors.

The call in procedure is set out in full in <u>Part 4 of the Council's Constitution, 'Scrutiny</u> and Overview Committee Procedure Rules'.
