GREAT SHELFORD CONSENT STREETS

Purpose

1. To seek approval for the designation of all the streets in the Parish of Great Shelford to be Consent Streets under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

Effect on Corporate Objectives

2. Quality of Village Life – to afford a degree of control on trading within the village.

Background

- 3. Great Shelford Parish Council requested that all streets in the Parish be designated as Consent Streets so that trading could be controlled. The Licensing Committee held on the 26th May 2005 agreed to that request.
- 4. A Notice of Intention to Designate all streets in Great Shelford as Consent Streets was published in the local press on 10th June 2005 with a deadline of 8th July 2005. No objections have been received.

Considerations

6. Fees would be required by Street Trading applicants that will cover the cost of administering this service.

7. Any refusal of a licence could be subject to an Appeal.

9. Once agreed to by Committee any person wishing to trade on any of the Streets in the Parish of Great Shelford, after the 1st September 2005, would be required to make an application for Street Trading Consent.

 It is recommended that the Committee resolves to designate all the streets in Great Shelford as Consent Streets under the terms of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 and proceeds to advertise the Resolution to take effect from 1st September 2005.
