Prior to consideration of the application for a premises licence, it was noted that the applicant had made an amendment to the application involving a reduction in timings concerning the opening hours and supply of alcohol.

The Panel considered the application very carefully and had due regard to the Licensing Act 2003, the accompanying Guidance and Regulations and the SCDC Licensing Policy. They heard the evidence of the applicant who said he had amended his application to help allay the concerns of his neighbours. The Panel also heard from the Environmental Health Officer that he had been working with the applicant regarding the siting of an extraction system at the premises. The applicant said that the extraction system was to be sited in such a way that there should be no external noise. The applicant also said that he would like an extension of hours on a very occasional basis so that wedding celebrations could be held on the premises.

The Panel also heard from four representees who lived close to the premises who welcomed the modified application and the information given concerning the proposed installation of the extraction system, but continued to express concerns about potential nuisance to their properties from the premises. The representees sought clarification of the potential conflict with the existing planning consent and were informed that the Planning and Licensing systems operated independently of each, but that action could be sought by a planning enforcement if the applicant breached the terms of his planning consent.

Concern was also expressed about the extension of the licence to off sales given the proximity of the nearby playing field. It should be noted that under Guidance, conditions relating to public nuisance caused by the antisocial behaviour of customers once they are beyond the control of the licence holder cannot be justified. Beyond the vicinity of the premises any individual engaging in antisocial behaviour is accountable in his own right. The representees were informed they had the right to a review of the licence if such a link could be proved in the future.

The Panel decided to **APPROVE** the licence application as amended to allow the licensable activities during the hours set out in the tables above. The applicant agreed that the following conditions should be attached to the licence to address the public nuisance concerns of nearby residents:

- No customers shall be permitted to drink outside the premises
- Bottles and other refuse shall not be placed in outside receptacles between 22:00-08:00hrs
- Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits, requesting
 patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and
 the area quietly.
- All doors and windows shall be kept closed during licensed entertainment events, except to allow access and egress from the premises, and if it proves necessary a self-closing device shall be fitted to the main entrance door to the premises.

Interested parties and responsible authorities may apply for a review of the licence on a ground relating to one or more of the licensing objectives should there be any relevant issues arising from the operation of the premises licence at any stage in the future. The four licensing objectives are: the Prevention of Crime and Disorder; Prevention of Public Nuisance; Public Safety and Protection of Children from Harm.

The applicant and objectors have a right of appeal to the Cambridge Magistrates' Court within 21 days of receiving notification of this decision.
