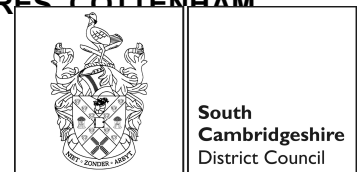

The applicant and objectors have a right of appeal to the Cambridge Magistrates' Court within 21 days of receiving notification of this decision.
