4. **Investment Partnership Training: 12 March at 12 noon**

It is proposed that Investment Partnerships will fulfil a substantial role in the delivery of the Council's Investment Strategy, with a £170m funding allocation in this investment stream anticipated by March 2024. It is proposed that Full Council will, on 2nd April, consider the recommendation from Cabinet on 4th March to enter into Limited Liability Partnerships with two Partners, Hill Partnerships Limited and Balfour Beatty Investments. It is essential that members who will be scrutinising this proposal are properly informed as to the nature and extent of these Partnerships. To this end, specific training on this issue has been organised on 12 March, timed to start and finish before the Scrutiny and Overview committee meeting.

The training will cover the following issues:

- The role of investment partnerships within the SCDC Investment Strategy
- Key ingredients for successful partnerships
- What the parties bring to the table
- Governance challenges within the investment partnerships
- Initial business case development and approval
- Exit strategies on investments
- Interaction between investment partnerships and Council policy framework
- Community engagement and public perceptions
- Case studies / experiences from elsewhere
- Legal basis (Haringey Case)

The training will be delivered by Chris Brain, an expert in the field who has previously provided member training to the Council on its Investment Strategy in April 2019. He is an expert in this field, able to easily disseminate what can sometimes seem an impenetrable subject in a highly accessible and enjoyable way.

5. **Appeals Hearing Training: 18 March at 1:30PM**

This training is designed to prepare Members to undertake appeal hearings effectively and fairly, taking into account developments in employment law and is suitable as a refresher for those who have attended previously, or for those who are undertaking this for the first time.

The training will cover the following key issues:

- Recognising the role of the Appeal Hearing in the relevant procedure.
- Exploring key legal and procedural points which must be understood when hearing an appeal.
- Practising key skills for Members involved in hearing appeals.
- Identifying the practical implications for Members in conducting Appeals Hearings.

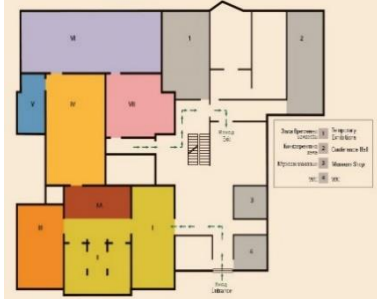

EXECUTIVE DECISIONS TAKEN SINCE WEDNESDAY 4 MARCH 2020

13. Communal Room Review Project -Decision Required Regarding the Future use of The Limes/Limes Close Sheltered Communal Room in Bassingbourn

Cabinet:

Approved the decision to transfer the sheltered community building at The Limes / Limes Close, Bassingbourn to Bassingbourn Parish Council on a long 99-yr full repairing lease with a peppercorn rent for use as a village community hall, with the costs of transfer to be split 50:50 between the district and parish councils, up to a maximum value in total of £18,000 (£9,000 each).

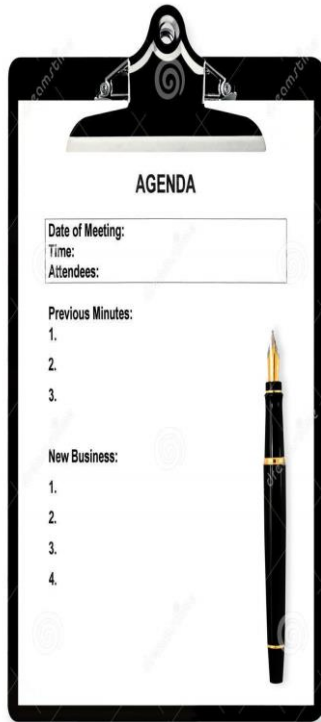

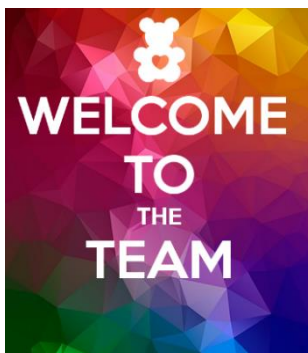

A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements

Construction work on the new A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon scheme is underway. We are currently carrying out a variety of tasks for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 8pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

Full closures

Monday 9 to Friday 13 (five nights)

- A1 northbound Brampton village entry slip

Vehicles can exit Brampton village via the A141 Racecourse junction

- A1 northbound Brampton Hut entry slip

Vehicles will be diverted east on A141 to Spittals and A1307 north to access A1

- A1 southbound Brampton Hut entry slip

Vehicles will be diverted east on A141 to Spittals and A1307 north to Alconbury and return on the southbound carriageway

- A1 southbound to A14 eastbound link Brampton Interchange junction 22

Vehicles will be diverted from A1M to A605 and join the A14 eastbound at Thrapston junction 13

Monday 9 to Thursday 12 (four nights)

- A14 eastbound Godmanchester/A1198 junction 23 to Swavesey junction 24

Vehicles will be diverted north on A1198 and then east on A1307 to re-join the A14 at Swavesey

- A14 westbound Swavesey junction 24 to Godmanchester / A1198 junction 23

Vehicles will be diverted west on A1307 and south on A1198 to re-join the A14. Vehicles wishing to later travel south on the A1 can continue south on A1198 and west on A428 to join the A1 at Wyboston

- B1049 northbound from Kings Hedges Road to Histon junction 32

Vehicles will be diverted via Kings Hedges Road, A10 to Milton Interchange, Butt Lane, Milton Road, Burgoynes Road and Impington Lane to access Histon & Impington

- M11 northbound junction 13 to A14 westbound Bar Hill junction 25

Vehicles will be diverted west onto A1303 to continue onto A428 westbound, A1198 northbound and either join the A14 at junction 23 for through traffic or continue north to join A1307 for local traffic.

- A428 eastbound Madingley to A14 eastbound Milton junction 33

Motorway traffic will travel south on the M11, east on A505 and north on A11 to re-join the A14. Non motorway traffic will be diverted on local roads through Cambridge.

- M11 junction 14 exit slip

- A14 westbound between Six Mile Bottom junction 36 and Girton junction 31

Motorway traffic will travel south on the A11, west on the A505 and then north on the M11.

Non motorway traffic will be diverted on local roads through Cambridge

Monday 9 to Tuesday 10 (two nights)

- Local road between B1050 Hattons Road and Oakington roundabout

Vehicles leaving Cambridge wishing to access Bar Hill and Longstanton will be diverted onto A1303 to continue onto A428 westbound, A1198 northbound to A1307 and continue east to Bar Hill junction 25. Oakington and Dry Drayton residents can use A1307 Huntingdon Road and local road.

Vehicles wishing to exit the A14 eastbound for Oakington and Dry Drayton will need to stay on the A14 and exit onto A1307 Huntingdon Road, to return west on the local road, past the Crematorium

Wednesday 11 to Thursday 12 (two nights)

- B1050 Hattons Road between local road and Longstanton roundabout

Vehicles will be diverted via local road, Oakington, Cottenham, Rampton and Willingham

Thursday 12 (one night)

- A14 eastbound Bar Hill junction 25 between exit and entry slips

Vehicles will be diverted via the exit slip and re-join the A14 via the entry slip

Friday 13 9pm to Monday 16 5am

- A14 eastbound Milton junction 33 exit slip

Vehicles will be diverted to continue east on A14 to Stow cum Quy junction 35 and return on westbound carriageway

- A14 eastbound Godmanchester/A1198 junction 23 to M11 southbound junction 14

Vehicles on the A14 will be diverted south on A1198 at junction 23 and then east on A428 to re-join the A14. Please follow signs on A428 for access to M11.

Vehicles on the A1307 will be diverted south on A1198 at Godmanchester and will pick up the same diversion listed above.

Access to Lolworth village, Herbies Diner & Travelodge will remain via Swavesey junction 24

- A1307 Huntingdon Road outbound

Vehicles will be diverted onto Histon Road to Histon junction 32 for access to A14 westbound

Friday 13 to Sunday 15 (three nights)

- A14 westbound Bar Hill junction 25 between exit and entry slips

Vehicles will be diverted via the exit slip and re-join the A14 via the entry slip

Saturday 11 (one night) 9pm – 8am

- Brampton Road B1514 between station car park and Edison Bell Way

Vehicles on the Huntingdon town centre side will be diverted onto the ring road, Ermine Street B1044 to Spittals roundabout, A141 west to Brampton / Brampton Racecourse junction and into Brampton via B1514. Vehicles on the Brampton side of the closure will follow this diversion in reverse.

SCDC A14 Cambridge- Huntingdon Upgrade Update March 2020

Dear Councillors,

As you may be aware Highways England have formally announced that they are set to open the A14 more than half a year early to drivers, this Spring.

This will mean that the main carriage ways will be open. However, a number of additional activities such as landscaping, installing new technology and other off-road tasks still need to be completed which will still involve overnight and off- peak daytime closures.

South Cambridgeshire District Council anticipate that the works will still be continuing for some months yet till completion.

- Environmental Health will continue to work closely with Highways England and our contracted independent noise consultants under a Section 61 agreement.
- As part of this agreement, Highways England apply for permissions (dispensations) if they need to carry out work out of core hours or above agreed noise thresholds and are required to demonstrate all best practical means are considered.
- Our team, supported by consultants, review and approve these dispensations on a case by case basis, the aim being to fully consider the impact of the roadworks for our residents whilst still allowing Highways England to complete their works.
- In doing so we consider both the direct impact on residents close to the works, and the wider impacts of the ongoing roadworks on other communities.
- In addition, we continue to deal with any complaints from residents and we carry out compliance monitoring of the works to ensure that Highways England and their contractors are adhering to agreed conditions.
- The ongoing costs to South Cambs are being recovered from Highways England wherever possible.

Whilst it is good news that Highways England are nearing the opening date of the main carriageway, we anticipate the ongoing works may mean a continued busy period for us all over the next few months.
