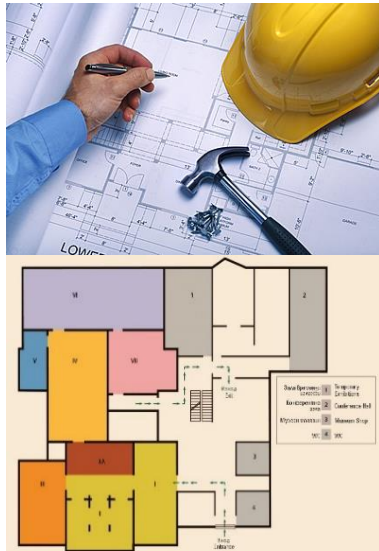

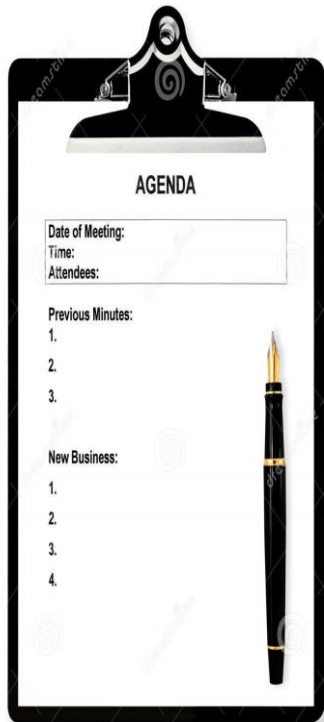

# Agenda Item 2

## **A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements**

We are currently carrying out finishing works for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 9pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

### Full closures

Thursday 25 February 8am to Friday 12 March 6pm

- Cambridge Road, Fen Drayton at its junction with A1307 eastbound  
Vehicles in Fen Drayton will be diverted via Swavesey Road, Rose & Crown Road and Buckinghamway Road to the A1307 at Swavesey. Vehicles on the A1307 eastbound will be directed to continue on the A1307 eastbound to Swavesey and via Buckinghamway Road, Rose & Crown Road and Swavesey Road for access to Fen Drayton

Monday 1 to Thursday 4 (four nights)

- B1514 Brampton Road between station car park and Edison Bell Way  
Vehicles on the Huntingdon town centre side will be diverted onto the ring road, St Peters Road to A141 west to Brampton / Brampton Racecourse junction and into Brampton via B1514. Vehicles on the Brampton side of the closure will follow this diversion in reverse.

Friday 5 9pm to Sunday 7 8am (35 hours)

- B1514 Brampton Road between station car park and Edison Bell Way  
Vehicles on the Huntingdon town centre side will be diverted onto the ring road, St Peters Road to A141 west to Brampton / Brampton Racecourse junction and into Brampton via B1514. Vehicles on the Brampton side of the closure will follow this diversion in reverse.
