Legislative efforts to ease the housing crisis in England are too vague and will result in court challenges, according to conservation charities who recently wrote to Housing Secretary Robert Jenrick to voice concerns about the planning bill.

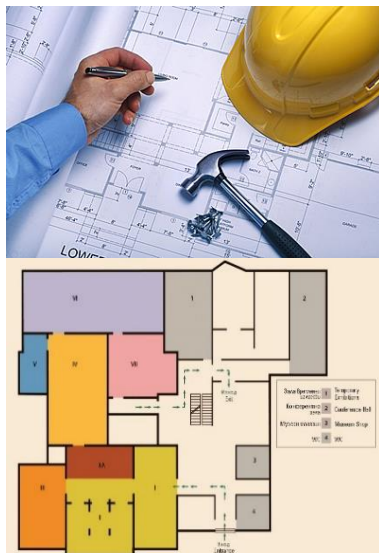

That record will bear the date on which it is published and will specify that the decision will come into force, and may then be implemented, on the expiry of 5 working days after the publication of the decision, unless called in for review by the Chairman of the Scrutiny and Overview Committee or by any five other councillors.

The Lead Cabinet Member for Housing agree to approve the request to waiver the local land charge of £7,010.

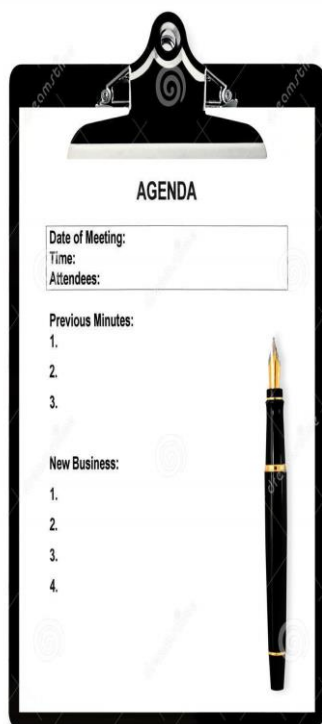

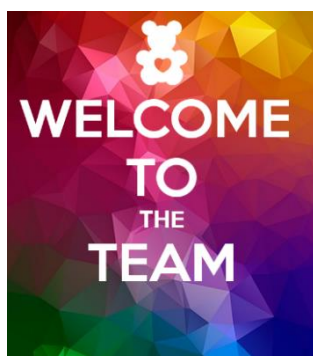

A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements

We are currently carrying out finishing works for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 9pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

Full closures

Saturday 24 6am to Monday 27 6am (48 hours)

- A14 westbound Godmanchester junction 23 entry slip

Vehicles will be diverted east on the A1307 to Swavesey and join the A14 westbound at Swavesey junction 24. Vehicles can also travel south on A1198 to A428 westbound, A1 northbound and join the A14 via Brampton Hut at New Ellington junction 21

Saturday 24 8am to 5pm

- B1514 Brampton Road between Scholars Avenue and Edison Bell Way

Vehicles on the Huntingdon town centre side will be diverted onto the ring road, St Peters Road to A141 west to Brampton / Brampton Racecourse junction and into Brampton via B1514.

Vehicles on the Brampton side of the closure will follow this diversion in reverse.
