4. M11 Junctions 8 to 10 Bridge Repairs

Highways England report that they continue to carry out essential work to replace the expansion joints and re-waterproof the M11 bridge over junction 9. They are also carrying out some resurfacing on the M11 between junctions 8 and 10. The work will be carried out between 9pm and 5am and all work is subject to weather conditions.

Northbound closures

M11 junction 8 to 10 northbound - Full closure

- Friday 10 December to Monday 13 December Full weekend closure (9pm Friday to 5am Monday)
- Friday 7 January to Monday 10 January 2022 Full weekend closure (9pm Friday to 5am Monday)

Northbound traffic will be diverted off the M11 at junction 8 onto the A120, A10 and the A505 before re-joining M11 at junction 10. (Diagram 1)

Southbound closures

M11 junction 10 to 9 southbound - Full closure

• Friday 17 December to Monday 20 December - Full weekend closure (9pm Friday to 5am Monday)

Southbound traffic will be diverted off the M11 at junction 10 onto the A505 and A11 before rejoining the M11 at junction 9. (Diagram 2)





A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements

We are currently carrying out finishing works for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 9pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

Full closures

Wednesday 1 December 9pm to 6am

• Grafham Road overbridge (over the A1)

Vehicles on the Brampton side will be diverted through Brampton via Park Road, to the B1514 and onto the A1 southbound to Buckden roundabout. From here the diversion will continue into Grafham via the B661 and Buckden Road to re-join Grafham Road.

Vehicles on the Grafham side of the bridge closure will follow this diversion in reverse.

Sunday 5 December 12.01am to 8pm

• B1514 Brampton Road between the RingGo car park and Edison Bell Way

Vehicles on the Huntingdon town centre side will be diverted onto the ring road, St Peters Road to A141 west to Brampton / Brampton Racecourse junction and into Brampton via B1514.

Vehicles on the Brampton side of the closure will follow this diversion in reverse.
