**2. Road Closures relating to A14 Improvement Scheme**

**3. Community Chest Grant Changes**

**Community Chest Grants - increase of maximum award**

The upper limit for all Community Chest Grant (CCG) awards has been increased from £1,000 to £2,000 per application. Increasing the upper CCG grant limit will allow community groups and, where eligible, parish councils to request a larger contribution to their projects. The Lead Cabinet Member for Finance agreed the change on Friday 26 November following a review by the Grants Advisory Committee. The change reflects the rising cost of materials which has meant most CCG applications have been for the maximum award.

**Inclusion of Biodiversity Grants**

Wildlife Enhancement Grants, formerly delivered through the Planning Service, will now be included within the Community Chest Grant (CCG) application process. These grants support

biodiversity projects through a ringfenced fund. Parish Councils will be eligible to apply for this funding, provided that they are not already in receipt of a grant from the Council's Zero Carbon Communities (ZCC) fund for the same financial year. Applications will be processed as part of the established CCG process and recommendations will be considered at Grants Advisory Committee (GAC) on a monthly basis. It is possible that some projects will include elements of the core CCG scheme and ringfenced biodiversity fund. By bringing the formerly separate schemes together GAC will be able to make recommendations to the Lead Cabinet Member for an appropriate award at the same time. This will enable us to support a diverse range of projects via the CCG scheme. £10,000 is ringfenced for these types of projects.

### **Funding for Community-Led Plans**

The Council is also putting £50,000 into a rolling fund for two years for grants for villages who want to develop a community-led plan, with the money to be earmarked for the initial development costs - such as printing, the delivery of surveys and costs involved in holding public meetings - rather than delivering the project. Applications for this funding will also be included within the Community Chest Grant (CCG) application process

#### **4. M11 Roadworks - Alsa Wood Footbridge**

What follows is a message from National Highways:

“Due to unforeseen circumstances, our work to the M11 Alsa Wood Footbridge will be carried out later than originally planned. Our work will involve waterproofing and resurfacing to the Alsa Wood Footbridge, located over the M11 to the west of Elsenham. Once finished, pedestrians and ramblers will benefit from a safer and smoother walking surface across the bridge.

“We now plan to complete this work over **2 weeks** from **Monday 6 December to Friday 17 December**, working on **weekdays only** between **8am and 6pm**, weather conditions permitting.

#### **Closures and diversions**

“For this work to be carried out safely, there will be a full closure on the M11 between junctions 8 and 10 northbound on Monday 6 December overnight from 11pm to 5am to install narrow lanes directly under the footbridge on the northbound carriageway.

“Northbound traffic will be diverted off the M11 at junction 8 onto the A120, A10 and the A505 before re-joining M11 at junction 10.

“The footpath leading to the bridge on either side will be closed 24/7 for the duration of this work. Pedestrians will be diverted to cross the M11 via the B1051 over bridge.

“Diversion maps for both drivers and pedestrians is attached.

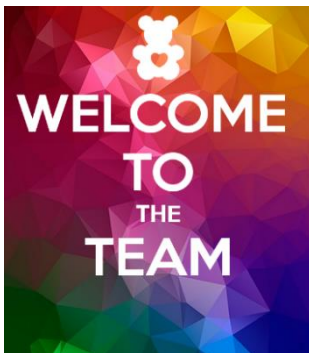

# Agenda Item 2

## **A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire: major improvements**

We are currently carrying out finishing works for which we need to close lanes or carriageways on the A1, A14 and some local roads at times, usually overnight between 9pm and 6am, unless otherwise stated. A clearly signed diversion route will always be in place for closures.

For this week, the planned closures are:

### Full closures

Monday 6 9pm to 6am

- A1 northbound between Buckden roundabout and A14 westbound Brampton Interchange junction 22

Vehicles will be diverted east on the A428 at Wyboston, north on the B1040 to join the A1198 and then onto the A14 westbound at Godmanchester junction 23. Vehicles can continue their journey on the A14 or exit onto the A1 at Brampton Interchange junction 22.

Brampton residents will be diverted on the B1514 to the A141 Racecourse junction to access the A1 at Brampton Hut

Wednesday 8 9pm to 6am

- A14 eastbound between Ellington junction 20 and Brampton Interchange junction 22

Vehicles will be diverted to exit the A14 at Thrapston junction 13 onto the A605 to then travel south on the A1(M) to re-join the A14 at Brampton Interchange junction 22.

- A1 northbound Brampton Hut exit slip

Vehicles will be diverted to continue on the A1 northbound to Alconbury, exit and return on the southbound carriageway for access to Brampton Hut for the A14 and the A141

Saturday 11 9pm to 6am

- A1(M) southbound between junction 14 and Brampton Hut

Vehicles will be diverted onto the A1307(M), exit to Spittals and west on the A141 to re-join the A1 at Brampton Hut.

Please note, there will be an 'up and over' closure at Spittals for those wishing to continue into Huntingdon; all traffic will be sent off to Spittals roundabout

Sunday 12 12.01am to 8pm

- B1514 Brampton Road between the RingGo car park and Edison Bell Way

Vehicles on the Huntingdon town centre side will be diverted onto the ring road, St Peters Road to A141 west to Brampton / Brampton Racecourse junction and into Brampton via B1514.

Vehicles on the Brampton side of the closure will follow this diversion in reverse.

Sunday 12 9pm to 6am

- A1 northbound between Buckden roundabout and A14 westbound Brampton Interchange junction 22

Vehicles will be diverted east on the A428 at Wyboston, north on the B1040 to join the A1198 and then onto the A14 westbound at Godmanchester junction 23. Vehicles can continue their journey on the A14 or exit onto the A1 at Brampton Interchange junction 22.

Brampton residents will be diverted on the B1514 to the A141 Racecourse junction to access the A1 at Brampton Hut
