Our overarching goal remains to successfully link market organisers with market traders, help identify additional skills and jobs opportunities, and remain aligned to our Business Plan for the social and economic well-being of business communities and residents.

We believe this will assist in the growth of the market and trader directories whilst also broadening public interest and support for emerging and aspiring small local businesses.

That record will bear the date on which it is published and will specify that the decision will come into force, and may then be implemented, on the expiry of 5 working days after the publication of the decision, unless called in for review by the Chairman of the Scrutiny and Overview Committee or by any five other councillors.

The Lead Cabinet Member for Resources **agreed** to accept the recommendations of the Grants Advisory Committee.

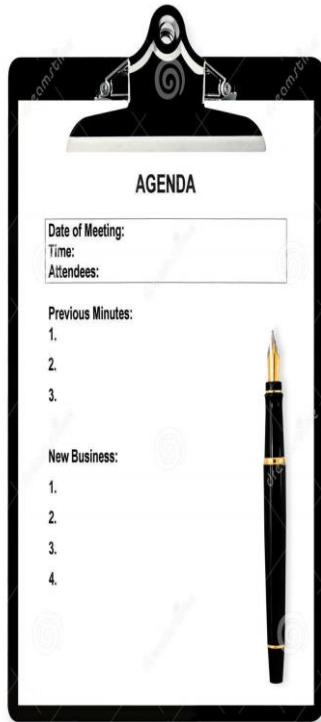
