9. Implications if not approved:

Under the Housing Grants, Construction and Regeneration Act 1996 SCDC, as a local housing authority, is under a statutory duty to provide grant aid to disabled people for a range of adaptations to their homes. The obligation to provide disabled facility grants (DFG's) to eligible applicants for eligible work (subject to a test of applicants resources) is primary and absolute. Legal have confirmed that we must carryout our statutory duty. This means that spending on mandatory DFG's can at best only be delayed.
