A participative expert symposium organised by Carbon Neutral Cambridge on behalf of South Cambridgeshire District Council and Cambridge City Council (TBC) supported by the Cambridge University's Centre for the Study of Existential Risk, South Cambs District Council, Cambridge City Council (TBC) Further sponsorship is anticipated from local businesses.

Objective:

- To help inform policy development for the new joint Greater Cambridge Local Plan.
- To help councils become confident and well informed in using their leadership, local planning powers and partnerships to accelerate the transition to Net Zero Carbon.

We understand that among the key questions that local councils would like to address are:

- What should a Zero Carbon target mean in practice to Councils?
- What powers (both soft power and statutory) are available to Councils to help achieve this?
- What examples are available to support the use of these powers.

To allow participants to share experiences freely, the symposium discussions will be held under the Chatham House Rule. It will be followed by the production of a professionally written 2-3000 word report on the recommendations arising from the day, to be used for public engagement purposes.
