14th September Parish Council Meeting

No agenda published on website or village noticeboard before meeting. The agenda is still not available on the website or the parish council noticeboard now. No minutes published in either location either. The notice board has been opened recently to include one of their posters "Wildlife or Disco"

2nd October 2020

Chair of Horseheath Parish Council starts campaign in Horseheath and surrounding villages to gain letters and signatures for his objection.

3rd October

At least 7 large posters are placed around Horseheath "Wildlife or Disco"
Posters are also reported to me from Bartlow, Cardinal's Green and West Wickham

4th October- Wildlife or Disco poster appears on Horseheath community facebook page.
Please see attached sheet for locals comments.

4th October – door to door knocking with posters being put through everyone's door. One senior lady the man tries to badger her into writing a letter

4th October e-mail arrives to everyone in Horseheath and surrounding villages. Surely it is their duty to ensure they inform the community of the correct information.

Dear friends,

You may have recently received a letter from South Cambridgeshire Council entitled 'Review of Premises Licence' and wondered what it had to do with you and not really given it a second thought. The review has been called in relation to a complaint raised by Horseheath Parish Council.

The license provides for rock festivals to be held in Crofts wood, behind the race course. You may have heard some of the music from the festivals, held controversially through the summer, however next year it is planned to hold 3, 3 day festivals for 10,000 festival goers - in the wood!

Whilst no one objects to the odd festival in the open, as long as the decibels are limited, to hold a festival in what is otherwise a very quiet, undisturbed wood, with the untold impact on the local wildlife would seem irresponsible.

Horseheath Parish Council are therefore concerned about the environmental damage to the wood; we believe that large numbers of people will bring an increase in noise and environmental pollution, litter and crime such as burglary; and the possibility of illegal raves on a site known for partying.

Furthermore we have every reason to believe that the conditions of the license - which takes no account of the location of the event, are likely to be breached based upon the Licensee's track record to date:

- There were 6 days of activity on site during this year rather than the 3 allowed by the conditions of the licence

- There has been no consultation with the Parish Council prior to events as the licence conditions require
- It appears there were no checks on the decibel levels at nearby residential properties
- It appears that the music continued beyond the scheduled time for completion on Sunday 13th September

The grounds for raising objections to the Licence under the Licensing Act are:

- Public nuisance (hours of operation, noise and vibration, light pollution and litter)
- Public safety (safety on the premises - fire safety, safe capacity and first aid)
- Crime and disorder (any crime, disorder or anti-social behaviour related to management of the premises. The act considers the manager cannot be held responsible for the behaviour of people outside the premises. With large numbers who may be intoxicated, I think there is room to consider this for our localities)
- Protection of children from harm

These are clearly based on the usual licensing of urban public houses. Given the importance of biodiversity loss and protecting wildlife, we believe this is also an argument which will have relevance to the District Councillors on the Licensing Committee who will undertake the review after the consultation period.

A few discos and a festival, on the Point to Point field, is one thing. But the licensed series of events represents much more than that. If you feel, as the Council does, that the scale of the events and disruption to the wood and to the village are not in Horseheath's long term interest, perhaps you would consider writing to the Licensing Office – the email address is Licensing Licensing@scambs.gov.uk – before October 27th – to add your concerns.

The attached poster, which will be put up around the village, over the next few days, summarises the Parish Council concerns.

Hi all

I have heard from the Chairman of Horseheath Parish Council that they are very unhappy about the events planned at Horsheath Point to Point and Crofts Wood next year. I attach the official poster.

Horseheath Parish Council is concerned about the environmental damage to the wood; as well as noise and general disturbance.

Neither Joe nor I have heard from anyone in Bartlow expressing concern about these events, which probably indicates that we don't feel it affects us. However, because of COVID we are not out and about chatting as much as usual and some of you may have concerns that we have

not picked up. Of course, anyone is free to make their own comments to South Cambs by 27 October as per the notice, but if anyone feels we should make representations for or against the licence as a Parish please let Joe or me know by, say, Sunday 11 October and we'll act accordingly.

My contact with John Howard this year.

18/06/20

E-mail to let him know about the charity live stream we did, not an event but "working" at a time when we had all been told to go back to work. You have a copy of this through him.

22nd/08/20

I called John Howard during event after receiving a text message. First priority and main concern was the access to the site from the previous evening which was no longer being used. He explained the history of why this smarted and upset the locals and the battle they had had with the landowners. He said he was glad to hear it was no longer being used. He stated this was the main reason for the call.

I explained the event had less than 300 people over the entire weekend and apologised that in the quick turnaround I had forgotten to e-mail, he accepted my apology.

He said when him and his wife stood in his garden the music was just audible. I said I was surprised as I stood in the car park at the moment and couldn't hear it. I told him I didn't know the DB level at that time, but we had limiters on it and that we had made sure no one needed to raise their voice to be heard above the music as per the government guidelines. I explained that the strong winds of up to 40 mph could have caused the problem the night before. I also told him our security were letting us know at both gates if they could hear the music and it was inaudible at the Manor Farm entrance close to Horseheath, he explained he was the closest house in the other direction.

Also mentioned police activity at 2am in his village, I explained the event ended sharply at 11pm and the site was cleared of those not staying by 11.30pm at the latest. He was surprised to learn the event ended so early (noise of music?)

23/08/20

E-mail sent to me at 8.49 following on from the previous evening discussion.

Dear Vicky

Just to thank you very much for calling me last night and to apologise - I was cooking at the time and I realise I called you Becky for some reason - I do apologise.

It was very helpful to talk. Just to reiterate, the music is quite audible at our west end of Cardinals Green; this has been the case whenever you have had a disco. We also hear the announcer on the point to point when they have meetings. We are about 1,200m directly from Crofts Wood, so I don't think it is the wind that is the main factor although that obviously helps sound travel. Residents in Horseheath also hear the music and are about the same distance away; see the screenshot from the Horseheath What's On Facebook page attached.

Just for your further information, residents of Cardinals Green have for years walked around some of the field margins. The hunt, a number of other horse riders, farm vehicles and the cross country runners also run across the field margins. Thurlow receives stewardship payments for the field margins as set-aside. There are no circular footpaths across Thurlow's land, so residents continue to use farm tracks and field margins connecting footpaths to walk on the south side of the A1307. The Estate and workers stop walkers off the footpath and tell them off, although I don't think there have been any prosecutions. I have previously suggested creating a permitted loop path which I think would help residents and preserve set aside areas, but the Estate has not been keen to engage with this. The Estate continues to be very forthright in admonishing residents on tracks, particularly anyone contemplating crossing the A1307 by their bridge - even local horse riders. Therefore the routing of public traffic through Horseheath and over the bridge touches a nerve in the village; we will also write to the SAG about it.

The Parish Council was disappointed not to have been contacted by you as the organiser of the events. There has been concern about the impact of the events on the local ecology and wildlife amongst residents. We are not sure if you can mitigate this.

Given the number of events proposed I think it would be useful if you could attend a Parish Council meeting. We have been meeting by zoom during Covid and our next meeting is Monday 14th September at 7.45pm. I have copied in our Clerk so that we can hopefully arrange for you to attend by zoom.

Second e-mail sent that day stating the police activity was poachers.

Dear Vicky

I understand from our neighbours that there were poachers out in the fields behind the copse last night. This was likely to be the cause of the police presence on Friday night. We do see them from time to time.

I would imagine the event itself, and particularly the route in through the farm being used has provided them with cover and that may be why we have seen this unusual level of activity. You might like to include this aspect in your communications with the police, Council risk assessments and of course Thurlow Estate.

I e-mailed John a reply

Hello John,

Thanks for your correspondence, I've also found it helpful chatting to you on the phone, it's good that we have communication channels open now.

I have a meeting with Tim Barling after the 12th and I will bring up the idea about the loop and locals using the footpath, it seems very strange they don't allow this on such a busy and dangerous road and I'm sure all those in Horseheath and Linton that attend the events would like to be able to use it, as well as everyone else outside of these times. We were very surprised to be asked to use this route and they have agreed it is unsafe and we won't be using it again.

As I mentioned to you I have a premises license to carry out events in the woods. These don't come easily and wildlife, sound monitoring, security, safe use of roads are all part of working with the council to get the license. As I mentioned we are giving money back to the local ecology and may well route this through a different avenue than the estate. This can be discussed in the new year.

The second and last event this year is on the 12th September, the date that should have been The Wild Wood Disco. This is called a sunset social and we have bookable tables, street food and bars and music at the top of the woods. We are saying under 300 people, when we did this before we had less than 200 on the Saturday and we expect it to be about the same. The music is 1pm - 11pm. We are using the main entrance and exit to the site and expect to have around 100 cars only. These events have been put on last minute after discussions with the council to try and get a tiny bit of revenue in during these very difficult times for anyone working in events. The last event was turned around in 3 weeks and this in 2 so we apologise for not letting you know in advance. I was very surprised the music impacted you at all and understand well why the route in would have concerned residents but with such few people we didn't feel it would cause issues.

I will plan to come to a parish council meeting in the new year to answer your questions. We speak with a lot of residents who are very supportive of the events too and give us lots of personal feedback.

Dear Vicky

Thanks for your helpful email. As you say it is good to have a good channel of communication.

The Parish Council has a track record of doing its best for biodiversity – we currently have a grant application in for increasing wildflowers along the verges and in public spaces and have an ongoing pollinator action plan for which we also received grant funding. We have recently been looking in to developing an area of native woodland. Twenty years ago, Horseheath raised a considerable sum of money to create a new wood – the “Millenium Wood”. This area was eventually developed between Castle Camps and Camps End, and is now a Woodland Trust site. It's a lovely area to wander round and is used by residents from several local villages.

We'd be pleased to talk more broadly with you in the New Year. We had been working on a Neighbourhood Plan although the future of this has been thrown in to doubt by the government's White Paper on planning reforms. So while I greatly appreciate the sentiment and help, don't worry about raising footpaths with Tim Barling – we will need to meet him in due course to follow up on whatever happens after neighbourhood plans.

By copy of this email I will ask John Miles to put the details of your event on 12th September on the local social media groups and our website; as we said it is really helpful for residents to know what is going on.

I look forward to talking further in due course and thank you again for making time to talk.

I can't remember the date, but we had a half hour positive phone call prior to the 12th discussing woodland events. I have never mentioned wanting to do 3, 3 day festivals for 3,000 , I mentioned as we may not be allowed to do the kind of events we normally run next year due to Covid that these socially distanced drink evenings might be more like the kind of events we have to put on. I explained again it was most sensible to meet in the new year when we had a better idea of what events would be possible in 2021. He at no point told me that the agenda of the next meeting would include the premises license.

Hello, I'm Vicky and I am the organiser of events in the Wild Wood. Firstly we have no plans to organise 3, 3 day festivals next year and our license does not allow that and it is not something we want to do. There are not going to be 10,000 people around next summer! We have never cleared trees or purposefully upset wildlife and would consider ourselves a company that is incredibly ecology minded, putting that before profit. We are decent people running a tiny company and have absolutely nothing to hide. if you'd like to find out the actual facts please e-mail vicky@thewildwooddisco.com or we can come to the pub to talk to people in a socially distanced way and answer any questions you have.

We have also been to this festival only living 2 miles away with our young family and it's run absolutely brilliantly and extremely considerately to its environment. I have lived in the area for my whole Life and think it's sad people can't get the facts and talk face to face before they start scaremongering and actually deal with their issues as a community working together.





