

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

3 Neighbours have made representation to the Parish Council. They have raised objections to the extension of hours and the amendment of the condition. Specific reasons:-

- 1/ Their enjoyment of garden space is severely impacted by noise/smells. Loud music, voices - from courtyard use and inside premises.
- 2/ Noise/smells permeate wattle & daub walls next door - very disruptive. Next door particularly affected - longer hours will exacerbate problems. LJ's have not worked with neighbours to address issues as promised (eg. noise attenuation insulated).
- Alcohol is being sold without food - contrary to licence.
- Deliveries early to premises are also causing problems - noisy/disruptive.
- Outside operating hours - licensee cleaning premises causes noise/smells - radio music loudly played early morning/late at night.

Environmental health have been contacted. 3 neighbours consider existing licence conditions are being abused / not complied with. Covid - open windows for ventilation will make noise/smells worse. Music/voices can be heard across street.
