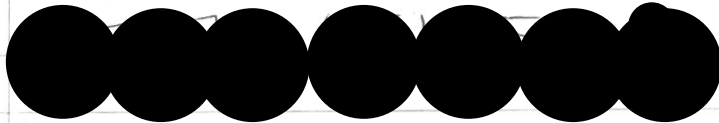



We deliver to LJ's sandwich bar 5 days a week. As you can appreciate the deliveries are made early because of the nature of the business as the bread rolls have to be prepared ready for store opening. Our driver delivers between 05:15 to 05:45.

The driver has been made aware of the noise complaint and has been instructed not to park in front of the complainant's house, to turn engine off whilst delivering, not have the radio on, to open and close as few doors as possible on the van while delivering and to our knowledge is complying with these instructions.

This has been a difficult time for our customers due to the covid restrictions not allowing them to trade. Now restrictions have been eased businesses are trying to recover customers and lost revenue. We are trying to be as supportive as possible for both our benefit.

Our deliveries are done on a round basis and due to this, getting to LJ's later would impact on all the other 30 deliveries on that round. Returning to deliver the goods later would also not be cost effective as it would be a 12-mile round trip and at the moment we deliver as we go past the door.

We write regarding LJ's Café in Church Street, Gamlingay. As close neighbours on this street, we can confirm that the restaurant has never caused us any problems and provides us all with a clean and well-run eatery serving delicious foods.

We are aware that current opening times permit the restaurant to stay open until ^{9.00}9.30 only. We have noticed that restricting the opening hours of this venue causes both us as customers and staff to rush through the process of settling, choosing meals, serving, eating and finalising bills rather spoils the experience of a relaxed meal out!

Extending opening hours till 11 p.m. for three evenings a week seems the most sensible solution. Like myself, most customers prefer to book their evening meal somewhere between 7.30 and 8.30 and the closure at ^{9.00}9.30 is simply impractical.

I write in relation to LJ's Bar and Brasserie (LJ's), Church Lane, Gamlingay.

I understand LJ's owner is seeking to extend the opening hours and license to sell alcohol.

My wife and I are fully supportive of his intentions, we both live in Gamlingay and since LJ's opened we have eaten there many times. LJ's is a real asset to the village and extending their opening hours, will give their customers, including us, more flexibility when reserving tables and not be time restricted.
