### **The Prevention of Public Nuisance**

This hotel is situated within a village and already has a licence for alcohol. Extending the licence to allow late night noise is inappropriate in such a setting. The hotel is surrounded on all sides by domestic housing. Local residents will be (and already have been) disturbed by the late night noise. This evidently creates public nuisance.

The applicants are already exceeding the terms of their current alcohol licence, through late night noise, and this variation is, in-effect, a retrospective application to align with their current practise. I suggest that an applicant that is exceeding the terms of their current licence should not be rewarded with an extended licence. Further, I have no confidence that the applicant will remain within the terms of any extended licence.

We have had to call for an ambulance to assist in dealing with individuals who have been drinking excessively at the hotel. Unfortunately, when we informed the duty manager, he tried to cancel that ambulance and take no responsibility, despite the individual being comatose on the driveway out from the hotel.

## Protection of Children from Harm

If the Licensing Authority considers that relevant representations are made the Licensing team will consider mediation meeting between the relevant parties to try and reach a settlement. If this informal process is unsuccessful a hearing before the Licensing Sub-Committee will follow unless the interested parties withdraw their representations.
