The Prevention of Public Nuisance

We object to all elements of the application on the basis of:

- The potential for noise & disturbance for local residents adjacent to and close by the hotel from music/events (live & recorded) is increased and this potential is 7 nights a week (rather than occasional events as is now the case).
- The potential for an increase in antisocial behaviour caused by an extension of the licence to sell alcohol is increased and the potential is 7 nights a week (rather than occasional evants as is now the case).
- Provision of extended hours for both live events and alcohol for non residents will encourage patrons from a much wider geography will acceberate the risk of public nuisance.

Duxford is a small and quiet village and well catered by existing pubs (and the Lodge). The Lodge is centrally located in the village and surrounded by houses. It's function is a residential hotel and not a latenight drinking venue/nightclub - there are plenty of options for people who want nightclubs in Cambridge which is 15 minutes away. The character of the village will be changed by granting a licence for live and recorded music and serving late night alcohol.
