The Lodge have also placed areas for alcohol and food consumption against a wall which is shared with their neighbors. This has already posed a nuisance to us with loud music, fumes, light pollution and customer noise causing disturbance. Even once the Lodge is shut for the night the clearing up process is noisy and the lights from the outdoor seating areas continue to produce light pollution into the family homes adjacent. The Lodge have made no effort to mitigate the effect their outdoor areas have on their neighbors, in terms of light pollution/customers able to see into neighboring properties/noise, nor are the neighbors currently informed of late night events.

Due to the points outlined above we cannot support the extension of licensing hours for the Lodge.
