UPDATE ON ANTI-FRAUD, CORRUPTION AND SECURITY HEALTHCHECK

Purpose

1. The purpose of this report is to update Corporate Governance Committee on the implementation of recommendations from an Anti-Fraud, Corruption and Security healthcheck review carried out by the Council's internal auditors, RSM Bentley Jennison.

Background

- 2. As part of their internal audit programme, RSM Bentley Jennison carried out a "healthcheck" review of the Council's anti-fraud, corruption and security arrangements. The healthcheck report covered a wide variety of areas and contained 43 recommendations, some of which were interrelated. The report did not suggest that instances of fraud or corruption, or security breaches, had occurred in any of the areas covered by the recommendations. Due to the wide scope of the review and report, managers' comments in response to the recommendations were collated by the Finance Project Officer.
- 3. The healthcheck review was mentioned in RSM Bentley Jennison's quarterly report to Corporate Governance Committee on 15 December 2008. The Committee requested an update at its next meeting. This report provides that update.
- 4. The healthcheck report's recommendations are summarised in Appendix A, together with:
 - (a) managers' comments made in response to the report's recommendations;
 - (b) updates on management actions taken / being taken / to be taken in implementing the report's recommendations.
