Planning and Economic Development Portfolio Holder Meeting

Development Briefs for Papworth Everard and Waterbeach.

- 1. In November 2002 the Council advertised for consultants to tender to prepare a development brief for the South West housing allocation at Papworth Everard. However, during the process of considering the received tenders, the agents for the landowners indicated that the landowner had offered to appoint consultants and bear the cost of preparing the brief as long as the District Council paid for the publication and distribution costs of the final document. After meetings with the landowner's agents, officers concluded that this would be a practical way to proceed which would have considerable cost savings for the Council and yet, at the same time, the Council would retain control as it had been indicated that the Council would only be prepared to adopt the brief as Supplementary Planning Guidance if it was of high standard and adequate participation and consultation had taken place. The local member has been kept informed of this matter and has indicated his general support for the approach being taken.
- 2. The landowner, through his agents, has now appointed a consultant to head the project and work has started.
- 3. Proposed Modifications to the Local Plan review put forward a new housing allocation at Bannold's Road, Waterbeach as a result of the Council accepting the Local Plan Inspector's recommendation. The Council has yet to consider objections. On this Proposed Modification there is but one representation from the Highways Authority which suggests that a satisfactory access solution can be found.
- 4. On this basis, and not pre-judging the outcome of Council's final decision on the Local Plan, it would appear prudent to prepare promptly a Development Brief as the developers who have an interest in the site have indicated that they wish to submit a planning application soon after Council's decision to adopt the Local Plan, and have further indicated that they are not prepared to undertake a Development Brief themselves.
- 5. It is suggested that the two most competitive firms from the Papworth tenders list, plus previous consultants who have prepared development briefs for the Council, be invited to interview. The local Members have been asked if they wish to take part in the selection process alongside the Portfolio Holder.
- 6. At this meeting, Councillor Simon Kime, as Portfolio Holder, supported the approach being taken for both Development Briefs.
