At an extra-ordinary meeting of the Cabinet held on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> January 2004 at 2.00 pm

Cabinet **RECOMMENDS TO COUNCIL** that the draft budget be produced incorporating:

- a. the identified savings of £146,000;
- b. only the inescapable bids of £94,000, the CASCADE bid of £224,000, Land and Property Gazetteer bid of £20,000, the senior Strategic Housing Officer bid of £43,000 and the plastics recycling banks bid of £50,000, the latter of which being subject to:
  - i. £50,000 costs in 2004/05 being funded by the DEFRA grant; and
  - ii. the ongoing revenue costs of £42,000 being funded from 'savings' within the Environmental Health portfolio;
- c. the additional expenditure on refuse collection and street cleansing service estimated at £76,000; and
- d. a Council Tax of £70 for 2004/05.
