Hello Jo

That would be fine; I'm on leave the week after next, but will need to write the report shortly thereafter (ie mid October).

I'm not sure if it's my place to give advice to your planning meeting, but:

- my understanding is that planning permission has been given for this development after an appeal to the Planning Inspectorate, and the path diversion is a condition for the development to take place;
- the "competent authority" (South Cambs DC, for whom we are acting as agents) can make but cannot confirm a diversion order if there are outstanding objections, but must refer the decision to the Secretary of State (that is, the Planning Inspectorate);
- if a local authority (which in this regard includes a Parish Council) objects, the matter must go to a public inquiry

So, the Planning Inspector would then be in the position where they were being asked to effectively overturn a planning decision, made by the Inspectorate, by rejecting the diversion order. I don't have sufficient experience of these matters to predict what they would do (and anyway the decision is entirely theirs not mine), but I would have thought they would take some persuading.
