Council therefore requests the members of cabinet to ensure that this practice ceases, and that meetings of the whole cabinet are open to members and the public.

Motion for Council Meeting Feb. 27 2003

That

South Cambridgeshire District Council is aware of pending legislation regarding the establishment of Regional Assemblies in England, including an Assembly for the Eastern Counties of England.

Council also notes that a body known as the East of England Constitutional Convention is meeting at intervals to discuss matters related to a possible Regional Assembly, and that there is a widespread assumption at these meetings that the Assembly if created will have its headquarters in Cambridge.

Council believes that it is not in the interests of this area with its flourishing economy to have the assembly, along with its civil servants and organisations whom it will attract in, based in Cambridge. In particular, we believe that it would worsen the housing crisis by attracting more high earners to the area, and conflict with local plan policies in the areas of employment, green belt and the expansion of Cambridge.

Council therefore and on these grounds resolves to:

- 1. Oppose the basing of any future East of England Assembly in or near Cambridge;
- 2. Seek the support of the City and County Councils for this policy;
- 3. Communicate this policy to the Chairman of the East of England Constitutional Convention, the Lord Bishop of St. Albans, in order that it may inform their future discussions.

In passing this motion Council at present takes no position on the desirability or otherwise of an elected assembly for the East of England or any other related matters.
