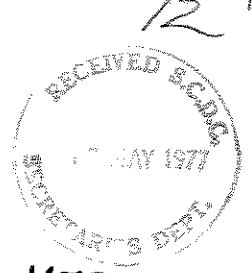

4. NOTICE OF MOTION

To consider the following Notice of Motion standing in the name of Councillor S.G. Harvey:-

Housing Capital Expenditure: Housing Strategy and Investment Programmes 1978/79 to 1981/82

1. That the Council expresses its concern about the delay which has already occurred in the provision of additional local authority housing in smaller villages and whilst noting that in some cases this is due partly to the non-availability of main drainage, is of the opinion that steps should be taken to overcome such problems.
2. That the Housing Committee be instructed to ensure that the introduction of new methods of dealing with housing capital expenditure allocations does not adversely affect previously agreed housing programmes for the smaller villages.
3. That an urgent report be submitted to the Housing Committee on the need for early decisions relating to the acquisition of suitable sites in those smaller villages which have previously been considered for inclusion in future housing programmes.

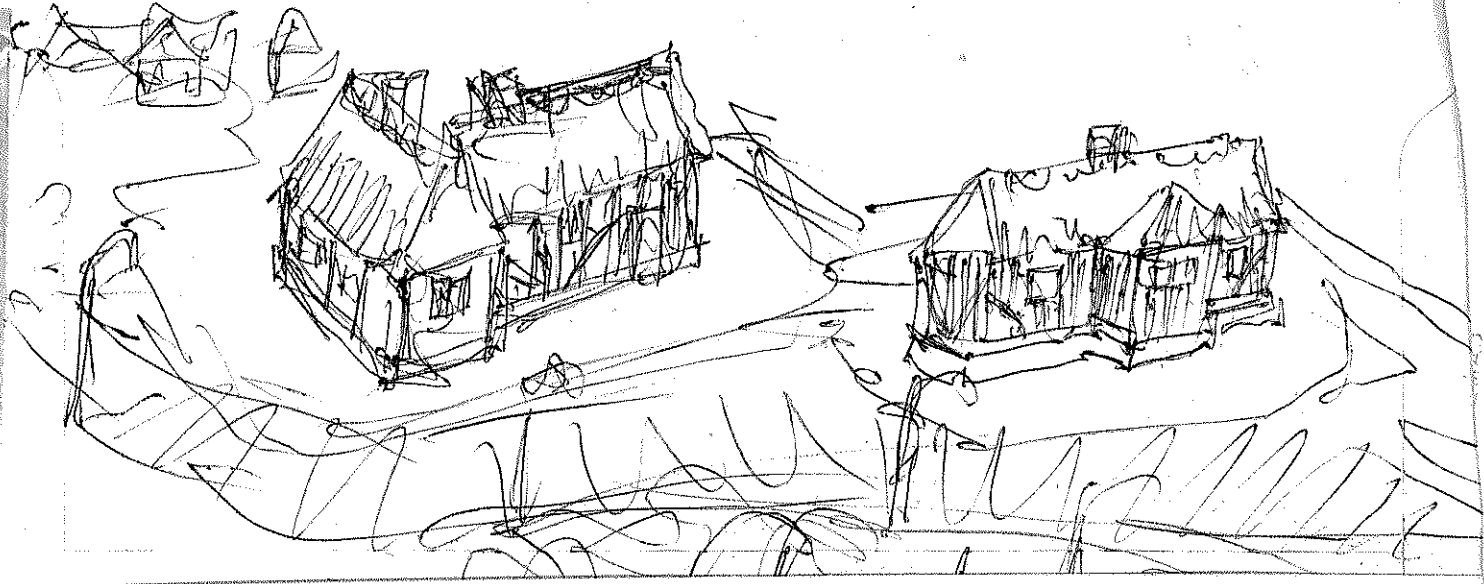
I herewith give Notice of the following motion that I wish to propose at the next Meeting of the Council;-

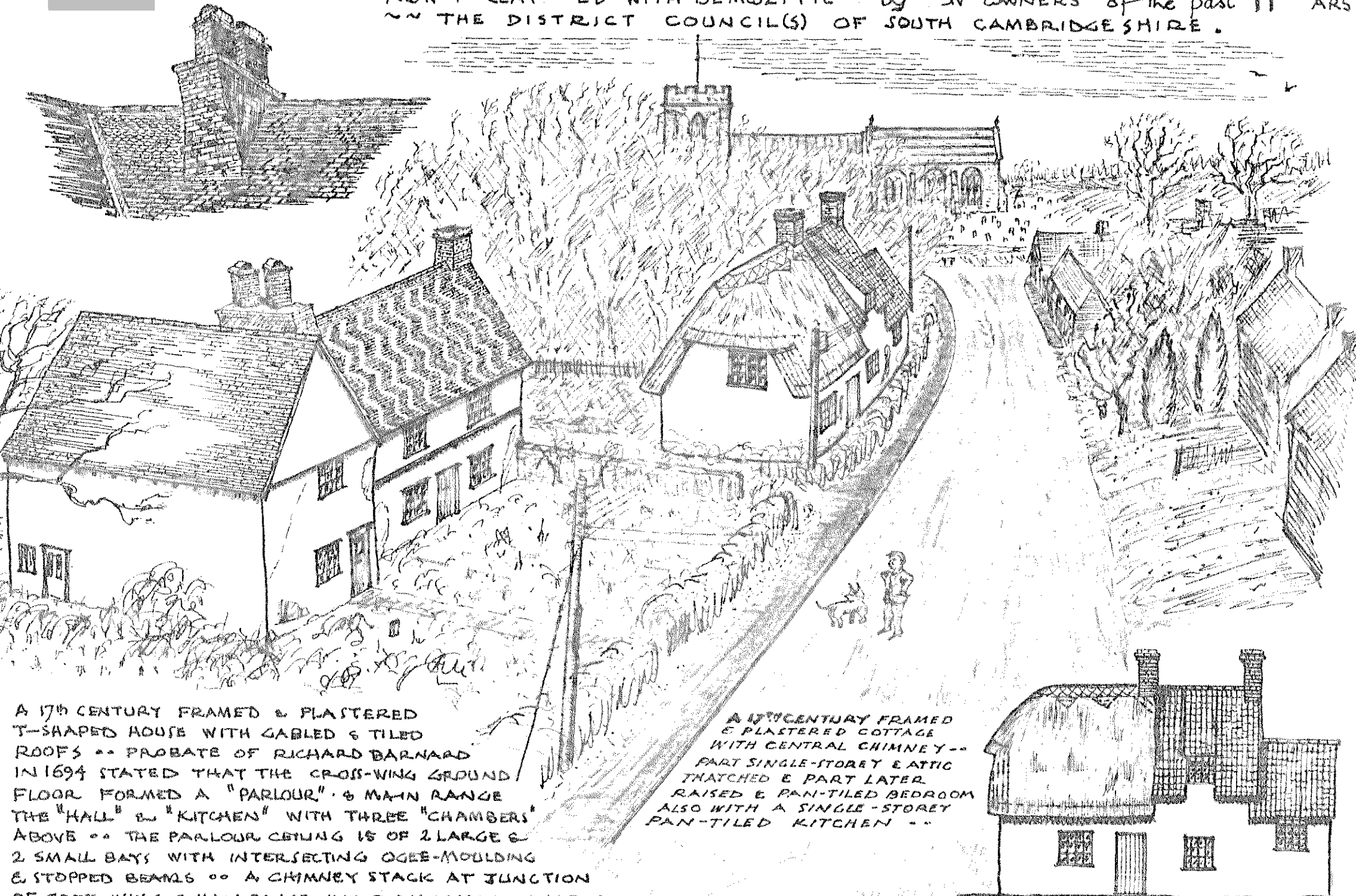

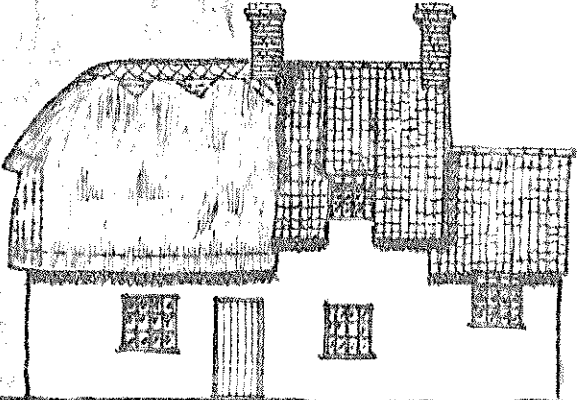

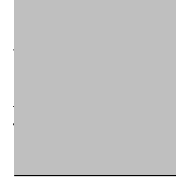
Will you please be good enough to arrange for the following motion to be included in the agenda for the next Council meeting on the 2nd March,
