### A PROPOSAL TO DEAL WITH THE SHORT TERM COLLECTION OF GRASS AND GARDEN WASTE

### 1. Grass and Garden Waste Collection

### 1.1 Motion

"That immediate steps are taken to introduce a monthly garden waste collection from all properties in the district for three months in this year and that cash limits for 1998/9 financal year be relaxed to allow associated additional expenditure of not more than £70,000 to be incurred."

### 1.2 Background

In reaction to the direction of Council we are pleased to note that the Enviornmental Services and Health Committee have referred the matter to their Recycling Sub-Committee in order to review the options for a medium and long term solution. However we feel that it is essential that we act quickly to provide a short term solution that will effectively address the problem for the remaining three months of this growing season. As time is very short we are bringing this motion before Council as it would be the only way that swift and effective action can be authorised.

### 1.3 Public Concern

It is very clear to us through representations from our consituents that there is strong public demand for action. This view is supported by the fact that more than TWO THOUSAND members of the public have phoned to complain about the current arrangements.

### 1.4 Recycling

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If we are serious about our responsibilities to encourage recycling then we must take the lead. As much as we may wish that the general public would actively compost and recycle more they will not do it if the local authority is not actively involved. We need to provide an option and facilities which will allow the public to do more. Moreover a collection from every household will eliminate all problems with defining the elderly and disabled.

### 1.5 Indicative Costs of Collection

From figures provided by the Chief Environmental Health Officer we can see below the likely cost of offering a monthly collection for three months for all households in our district-

Based on his figures:

- (i) 50,000 properties in the district
- (ii) 8,000 per week collected per crew
- (iii) average of 20 kilos of waste per property per visit
- (iv) sacks cost £48.64 per thousand
- (v) "gate" charge £25 per tonne levied by composting company

vi) recycling credit of £21 per tonne.

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These costs could be further reduced by assuming that the present distribution of sacks includes provision for grass cuttings and that the public could purchase additional ones from supermarkets for this year if they wish.

# This would reduce the overall costs to £55,025 or £1.04p per household

### 1.6 Funding

For this year it is probably not feasible to make a charge but we understand that the Council could absorb costs in this range this financial year. However there should remain the option to levy a charge if administratively cost effective.
