## Motion for Meeting of Council on 11/12/03

### *That*

South Cambridgeshire District Council notes the decision of the Deputy Prime Minister to uphold the appeal of the University of Cambridge against the decision of this Council to refuse planning permission for a primate research centre at 307 Huntingdon Road.

Council also notes that the planning inspector who heard the appeal upheld the position taken by the District. He also stated that he found the medical/scientific evidence inconclusive, and did not find objective evidence that this development would be in the "national interest".

This being so, Council is extremely disturbed at the granting of approval by the DPM, as it undermines local accountability in the planning process. Council is also seriously concerned that a significant proportion of the costs of additional policing will be borne by the taxpayers of Cambridgeshire, to the detriment of effective local policing.

Council therefore:

- 1) Calls upon our local MPs to raise these concerns with the government;
- 2) Resolves to examine what legal recourse we have to obtain a review of this decision in the light of the DPM's use of the argument that alternative sites could not come forward in a reasonable time frame/timescale, whilst the University is widely reported as saying that funding is not yet in place to implement any permission granted, which argues against great urgency.

I would be grateful if these two Notices of Motion could be included in the agenda for the next meeting of Full Council.

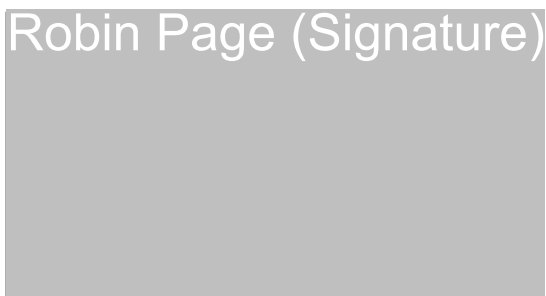
